THE PROVIDENT GOD—"My God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus."—Philippians 4:19.

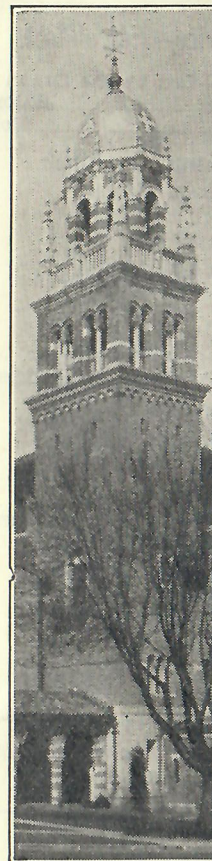
