



## GREAT LAKES CHURCH - GROUP QUESTIONS - WEEK 1

This week, we wrapped up our series called Future Church where we take a look at where we've been and most importantly, where we're going. Right now, there is a lot of uncertainty everywhere you look but the future of the church has never been in question because God is always at work.

One of the things Dave talked about this week was the importance of recognizing the impact that God's faithfulness has on our lives past, present, and future. Teaching us that we prepare for the future by doing 4 things;

1. **Reflecting on what God has done** - *What situation did you think you'd never make it out of but looking back, you can see God's faithfulness during that time?*
2. **Recognizing what God is currently doing** - *Where is God currently moving in not only your life but the lives of those around you?*
3. **Living with faith-filled expectancy.** *Do you believe that God really can move in your life?*
4. **Doing all that we can do now** - *Are you taking the necessary steps to make sure that you're prepared for God to move?*

This week, we're going to take a look at how these 4 things are currently at work in our lives and discuss new ways in which we can live out these 4 principles.
