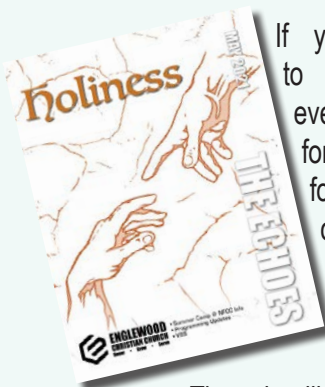

Foundation of Love

I had a lot of responsibility growing up. I was the oldest of four children, and the daughter of a single mom. I don't ever remember a time when I wasn't helping around the house. One of my jobs was having the kitchen cleaned before my mom arrived home from work. I tried my best to get it clean, but more often than not, I'd fall short of her standards. She had a saying she'd use when she was yelling at me about it. The G-rated version of this insult is I did a "half-donkey" job of it. It was a constant back and forth between us. She'd give me a job, and I'd somehow fail to do it right. I knew my mother loved me, but I grew to think how much she loved me hinged on my ability to be the perfect daughter. I can still hear it just as clearly in my head, like she's in the room saying it today. This trauma from my past manifests itself as a wall of insecurity impacting my ability to handle relationships with other people. If I keep to myself, then no one will ever see my flaws. And if I hide the flaws, then I won't disappoint anyone. But underneath all that fear is a heart which desperately desires to be loved. So how do I learn to override my feelings of inadequacy in order to accept the love I deserve?

The Bible is full of people who probably felt like they weren't good enough. Among the twelve disciples were average fishermen, a tax collector, a thief, and a zealot (and those are the things we know about them). Our first VBS lesson uses the calling of one of the disciples in Matthew 9:9-13, as the perfect example of Jesus' love. As a tax collector, Matthew was universally hated by everyone except maybe other tax collectors. Even the religious leaders of the time wanted nothing to do with him. When Jesus sat down to dinner at Matthew's house, many of his peers and fellow sinners were there as well. To the Pharisees, eating with sinners made you equally sinful/unclean, and by doing this, Jesus was challenging their whole belief system. He was trying to teach them one's past actions can be overcome, and He cared more about the heart than any prior transgressions. Jesus sought out and persuaded Matthew to join him, no prior qualifications or test required.

It's difficult for me to fathom a love I don't have to earn, much less to accept it. When I look back at my childhood, I can see all the times Jesus put His hands out for me to grab hold of. I remember hearing His call when I was learning about the gospel in the little country church with my mamaw when I was in preschool. He was there in the back of a bus ministry in elementary school when I was eight and accepted Jesus, even though I didn't fully

understand what that meant. Then later when I was in middle school, He sought me out again, and I was baptized. Those were my victories, but He was there for me in my defeats as well. When I was late getting my college applications out and worried I wouldn't get accepted, He encouraged me to submit them anyway. When I struggled at work and lost my job, He carried me to an opportunity I could never have anticipated. I'm not perfect, and never will be, but God doesn't require my perfection. My favorite band NeedtoBreathe has a song "Who am I," which has helped me a lot when I struggle with those feelings of failure. The line that always hits me the hardest says this:

"The way I push you through it, what you had to see.

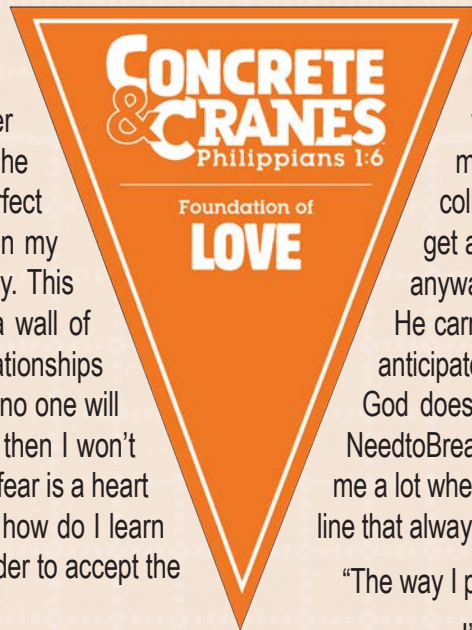
I'm a trainwreck, I'm a mess,
you see the best and the worst in me.

Still I can't imagine that I've earned your trust,

I don't understand where your love comes from.

Who am I, who am I, who am I, to be loved by you."

I think we've all asked that same question, "Who am I to be loved?" But thankfully God can turn past rejections into our personal redemption story. His love isn't dependent on a clean kitchen or getting all our chores done. It is given to us freely as a gift. Jesus told the Pharisees when they questioned Him in Matthew 9:13, *"But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice. For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners.'"* So when you feel like you are not enough, remember Jesus chose you. Don't ask, "Who am I to be loved?" but declare, "I am one who is loved."





Foundation of Forgiveness

The definition of forgive is “stop feeling angry or resentful toward someone for (an offense, flaw, or mistake) and to cancel (a debt).” It’s simple, but it’s not easy. Forgiveness is hard! It is extremely difficult to forgive, someone who has wronged you. If you are one of those people who do not find it difficult to forgive, then I would love to sit down and have a conversation with you on how forgiveness comes easily to you. For the majority of us, forgiveness is extremely difficult.

There was a time when Julie and I had just had the twins, forgiveness played a big part in our marriage. We needed to make some big decisions for the future of our family and where we were going to live. This decision lasted, what seemed like forever, but only lasted several weeks. The only problem with trying to make these decisions is we were operating on very little sleep, so we were extremely tired and extra irritable, and life-changing decisions should not have been made. Our marriage took a big hit during this time. We were making decisions based on our own personal interests and not the interests of each other. We were living under the same roof, but we were definitely not living like two people who loved and cherished each other and who were devoted to each other. We were essentially living two separate lives. We had bitterness in our hearts towards each other because we both thought our decision was the right one and the other one didn’t love the other enough to change. God was definitely not at the center of our marriage, and it showed. It took sitting down and talking to two of our closest mentors/friends to see the error of our ways and to finally forgive each other. We’ve definitely had issues in our marriage throughout the years, but this period of life helped us grow and overcome those obstacles. Forgiveness is possible no matter how hard it may be.

Let’s look at a Biblical example of forgiveness – the Apostle Paul. This guy persecuted and murdered Christians because he thought what he was doing was right. He was probably one of the most feared men at the time because of all the persecution he brought upon those who followed Christ. But that did not stop Jesus from appearing to him and telling him he had

been chosen to spread the good news.

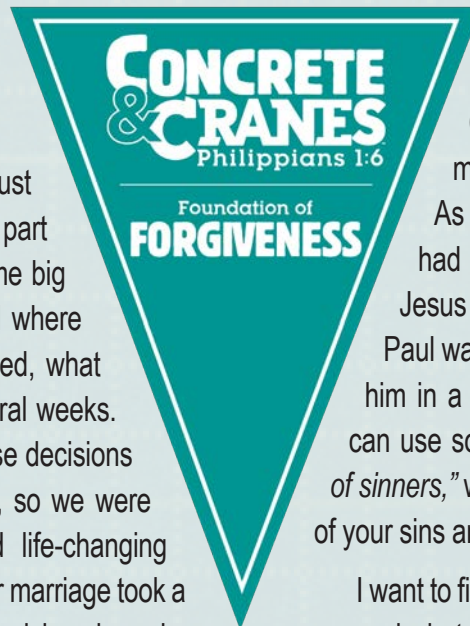
Jesus used a guy who had murdered His followers to be the mouthpiece of the Christian faith and one of the more, if not the most, prominent figures in all of Christianity. As our e-city kids will hear during VBS, “Paul had done nothing to deserve being chosen by Jesus to share the good news. However, because Paul was obedient, God empowered him and used him in a mighty way to spread the gospel.” If God can use someone who is self-proclaimed, “*the worst of sinners*,” what makes you think God can’t forgive you of your sins and use you to spread the good news?

I want to finish this with two verses which sum up who we are and what we mean to God.

“I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.” (Philippians 1:6)

“But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” (Romans 5:8)

When you are questioning who you are and why Christ would love you enough to forgive you, look back to these Scriptures. Through Jesus we are offered forgiveness and freedom. Here’s the truth, Jesus loves you and He wants you to live in freedom from the bondage of sin - this is possible because of His forgiveness.



Foundation of Worth

Have you ever been let down? Maybe you were stood up on a date. Maybe your spouse or children said they would do something, but they didn't follow through. Maybe you had an expectation, and things just didn't turn out the way you thought they would. Or maybe you have been the person to let someone down. I once let down a friend, and she ended our friendship. This wasn't during childhood; we were in our thirties. She was dealing with a personal disappointment, posted about it on social media and thought I should have reached out to her. I probably should have, but I was in a stressful time of life and ministry. Sometime later, she called and said she wanted to end our friendship. Looking back, it's like she was saying, "You're not worth the time and energy of friendship anymore." (Side note – after some counseling on another matter several years later, I looked back and saw it wasn't a healthy relationship, so for it to end was a good thing).

We base so many of our decisions on a scale of worth. Is it worth my time? Is it worth the amount of energy it will take? Is it worth the cost? Is it worth the calories? Sometimes based on our energy level, bank account or mood, the situation in question may move up or down the scale. For example, 9:00pm ice cream runs are not typically worth it to me. Leave the house? Are you kidding? I'm in my pjs! Not gonna happen. But catch me on the way home from an event, and I'm all in. Another one for me is cooking and eating at home versus eating out. It's usually worth the time and energy to plan, meal prep and cook at home, but not on Friday nights. At that point of the week, I'm done. Take me out to dinner, or I'm stopping to get something on the way home. Most of the time, it's not worth the energy.

In Matthew 26:36-46, we read about some of Jesus' last moments with His disciples. While in the Garden of Gethsemane, He told Peter, James and John He needed them to pray for Him, but when He came back after praying on His own, He found them sleeping. As you know, it happened again just moments later. How frustrating and disappointing this must have been for Jesus!

At this point, I wonder if He thought something like, "I'm literally pouring out my life for you, and you can't even take a few minutes

to stay awake and pray. This isn't worth it. You're not worth it." I know many people are tempted by similar ideas. They may not sound as harsh as they appear on paper, but just look at the number of broken marriages, abandoned children, and in my case, ended friendships. Because Jesus was tempted in every way, we can be almost certain He would have been tempted to give up on His friends. He would have been tempted not to see their worth.

Thank God He didn't. Thankfully, our worth isn't based on anything we do or don't do. Our worth is based solely on the fact we were created. In fact, Scripture says, "*While we were still sinners, Christ died for us*" (Romans 5:8). Jesus could have called down the angels to rescue Him from the agony of the cross. He didn't. He chose to die. He saw our inherent worth and acted graciously.

I was recently listening to a favorite song ("Jireh" by Elevation Worship and Maverick City Music) and caught the lyrics of the bridge. It was perfect timing.

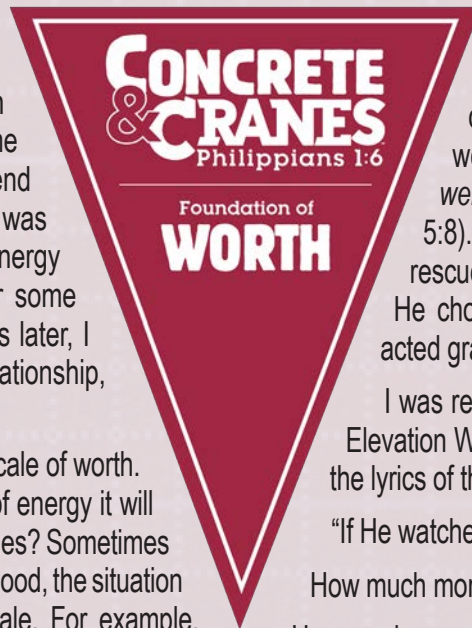
"If He watches over every sparrow

How much more does He love you?

How much more does He love you?"

It's based on Luke 12:6-7, "*Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God. ⁷ Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows,*" and Matthew 6:26, "*Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?*" We have worth and value in our Father's eyes. We never have to worry about whether or not He will look at us in frustration and say, "You're not worth the time and effort."

If you're struggling with seeing your value and wondering if you're worth God's time and effort, remember His perfect and gracious love. He chose to die. You were worth the great effort. You are worth His love.





Foundation of Promise

"Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

There are many, many, MANY promises in scripture made by God to His people. In each of these promises, we have a hope. In each of those hopes, we have a future. In each of those futures, we have a God who has come through on each and every one of the promises He has made to us. However, this particular promise is special to me because the hope of this promise means I am never alone. The hope of this promise is when Jesus is with me, I can be content in any situation. When Jesus is with me, His power and His authority reign in my life. When Jesus reigns in my life, the weight of the world's cares, worries, consequences and sufferings fall off of my shoulders onto Him. He carries them, and I am never alone.

If you struggle with giving control over to God, consider this promise. If you struggle with depression or loneliness, consider this promise. If you struggle with broken relationships, trust in this promise. If you have anxiety over what will happen to you or the people around you, remember this promise. Those who hold this promise close and trust in it completely will experience freedom, comfort, company, security, restored relationship and peace. If you want to experience these things, I ask you to explore four questions with me:

1) Do you know that Jesus is with you?

I know, but I don't trust. I know, but I don't care. I know, but I do the opposite. Much of what we do, does not reflect what we know. We conform to the pattern of the world instead of being transformed by the renewing of our minds. If you know Jesus is with you, my prayer is you would be comforted by that fact. I pray you would act: release and relinquish the weight of the world you carry on your shoulders and surrender to your knowledge – Jesus is standing right there, ready to take your burdens away. Will you let Him?

2) Do you know that Jesus is with you?

When Jesus is *with* me, I am never alone. This hope of the promise leaves me secure in my relationship with God. When

Jesus is *with* me, I have access to His comfort, His company, His encouragement to me, and His peace. If you need peace in your life, know that Jesus is *with* you.

3) Do you know that Jesus is with you?

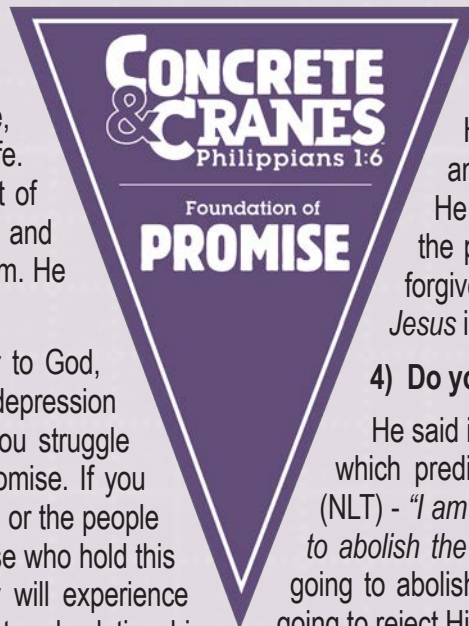
This is the same Jesus who healed the sick, parted seas and commanded nature with such authority it could do nothing but obey. This is the same Jesus who took on the consequence of all humanity's brokenness and healed it by giving His life in exchange for all of ours. He completed the greatest redeeming work anyone on heaven and earth ever has, and He did it for *you*. If you find yourself doubting the power of God to protect, guide, restore, or forgive, remember this hope of the Promise – that *Jesus is with you!*

4) Do you know that Jesus is with you forever?

He said it: to the very end of the age. The prophecy which predicted this promise lies in Jeremiah 31:36 (NLT) - "*I am as likely to reject my people Israel as I am to abolish the laws of nature!*" God, of course, is never going to abolish the laws of nature, just like He is never going to reject His people. He will never reject you for all the sins you've committed. You've repented and been redeemed from them. If you doubt Jesus is going to stay with you...think again! He is with you *forever*.

Don't be overcome by the evil one's lie that you are alone. After Jesus rose from the dead, as He was sending the eleven disciples out, the Bible tells us some of them doubted, and it's to those who doubted He said this in Matthew 28:18-20: "*All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age*" (emphasis mine).

There are many promises in the Bible. If you hold on to any of them...hold on to this one and start TODAY. Jesus loves you, and He is with you. Don't you ever forget it!



Foundation of Life

I remember growing up and attending Children's Church at South Daytona Christian Church. We often sang the song, "The Wise Man Built His House Upon the Rock," which is basically a retelling of the parable of Jesus found in Matthew 7:24-29. This is a great and powerful message by Jesus used to illustrate the importance of putting wisdom into practice. Hmm...sounds extremely familiar, like we may have just completed a sermon series from Proverbs with that same basic principle!! Okay, enough preacher talk; now back to my childhood.

Growing up near the beach, we also took many trips there. One summer we went to the beach just about every morning. We would play in the sand, swim in the water and just have a great time. It was myself, my baby brother and two or three other young children my mom would care for during the summer months. A common activity for this young group (I was the oldest at nine) was to make the best attempt to build a sand castle. I'll tell you up front, it was a futile effort because of where we usually sat on the beach – far enough away from the water but close enough we did not have to cross the traffic lanes (Daytona Beach – you can drive for miles on it!!!). This meant our efforts would always fail because the tide would relentlessly come in and continuously pulverize our castle with wave after wave of fast running water. That didn't stop us from trying to build a strong enough fortress each day. We tried solid, thick walls of sand formed by hand – that didn't work. We tried to use buckets full of sand firmly packed to the top – that didn't work either. We even tried to dig a trench around our castle, hoping the water would just flow around our massive creation, but the water treated our trench like it was only a speed bump – total destruction once again.

I look back now and think how foolish it was to attempt to build a castle over and over and over again, hoping beyond hope our great plans would succeed, and we would build

a castle strong enough to withstand the crushing force of the incoming tides. It was only a few months later when a professional sand sculptor revealed the only way to build a sand castle and not have the waves destroy it – he built it inside a local shopping mall, miles away from the beach!!!

I think our lives can be quite similar to my childhood sandcastle building endeavors. How many times have we tried to accomplish something on our own – our own selfish desires, our own limited abilities, our own broken experiences, our own misled conclusions, our own preconceived thoughts and our own foolish pride – only to see it come crashing down because it couldn't withstand the attack from outside forces? Let me be clear – I'm not talking about sand castles anymore! I'm talking about our own lives – our families, our marriages, our careers, our finances and more! How many times do we have to suffer from the destruction of the most important aspects of our lives before we finally realize we can't depend upon our own ways? How long before we finally comprehend the underlying truth in all of those personal disasters? We built it all on a shaky foundation!!

Like Jesus said in Matthew 7:26, "...everyone who hears these words of mine AND PUTS THEM INTO PRACTICE (emphasis mine) is like a wise man who built his house on the rock."

Let's break the habit of listening to the words of Jesus and not putting them into practice – that only leads to destruction and demolition because our foundation is weak and vulnerable. Let's begin to hear His words and pound them into the foundational aspects of our lives – who we are, what we believe, where we are spending eternity and who are we telling about it. Only then will we be able to withstand the crashing waves and strong tides working against us. Only then can we truly be safe and secure.

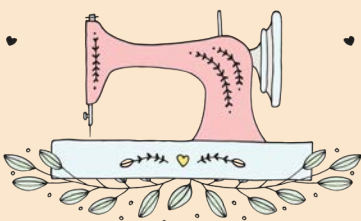

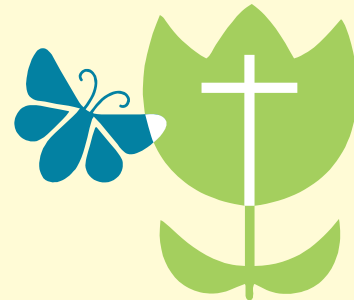


Young Adults Mini Golf & Ice Cream Night was a blast. No golf balls were lost to the water hazards!
