

Living the Lord's Prayer



We are excited to announce an upcoming sermon series that delves into the profound depths of the Lord's Prayer, beginning the weekend of March 1st and 2nd. This series aims to enrich our understanding and deepen our relationship with God by exploring various sections of this foundational prayer.

March 8/9 – Recognizing God as God

This message will focus on the reverence due to God's holy name, as we consider the phrase "hallowed be thy name" (Matthew 6:9). We will explore the balance between viewing God as a close Father and honoring Him as the transcendent, infinite Creator-worthy of our adoration and praise.

March 15/16 - Recognizing God as Our Father

We will reflect on the intimate relationship we share with God, emphasizing the personal nature of addressing Him as "Our Father" (Matthew 6:9). This sermon will challenge us to embrace and accept God's paternal love, moving beyond fear to a place of trust and closeness.

March 22/23 - Recognizing God as Lord

We will delve into the submission to God's sovereign will, reflecting on "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done..." (Matthew 6:10). This sermon will encourage us to align our lives with God's purpose, becoming active participants in His divine plan.

March 29/30 - Recognizing God as Our Provider

Focusing on "Give us this day our daily bread" (Matthew 6:11), we will discuss trusting God for our daily needs. This message will highlight God's role as our sustainer and the importance of bringing our petitions before Him with confidence in His provision.

April 5/6 – Recognizing God as Our Savior

We will confront our need for forgiveness, contemplating "forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors" (Matthew 6:12). This sermon will address human sinfulness and the liberating power of God's grace through Christ, encouraging regular confession and the embrace of His mercy.

April 12 – Recognizing God as Our Guide

Concluding the series with "lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" (Matthew 6:13), we will explore how God guides us through life's challenges. This message will offer insights into discerning and following God's direction, trusting in His protection against the trials we face.

Join us for this journey through the Lord's Prayer, as we seek to deepen our faith and understanding of God's multifaceted relationship with us. Each week promises to offer fresh perspectives and practical applications to enrich your spiritual walk as we explore the words that Jesus shared with us on HOW to pray.

The Venue Ministry (services designed for those in nearby assisted living facilities) are being held in three different locations, and if you talk to those who are involved in volunteering in this ministry, the response is overwhelmingly positive. **Neal and Kim Sullivan** are the Venue Coordinators, and we recently divided the ministry into two distinct but similar parts: **Venue Service Volunteers** and **Venue Care Volunteers**.

Venue Service Volunteers attend a service at one of the assisted living facilities each month and assume a role (greeter, usher, pastor, keyboard or worship leader). They are present to interact with the residents and to provide a meaningful worship experience.

Venue Care Volunteers step into the lives of individual residents and make visits to the assisted living facility at some point throughout the month in order to offer support and connection to those who may be lonely, sad, or in need of a listening ear. The gift of presence means a lot to the residents.

If I check an item out, when is it due?


You are on your honor to return the item when you are through with the item.

Reach Beyond is very grateful for the long-term relationship they have had with Palm West Community Church. Reach Beyond is working in 50 different countries with Voice and Hands projects. The VOICE PROJECTS broadcast Evangelical programs through FM, shortwave, satellite and Internet radio into areas that are closed to missionaries openly sharing the Gospel. HANDS PROJECTS include drilling clean water wells and agricultural projects that open opportunities for sharing the Gospel.

Recently, Ali was listening to a Radio Vida broadcast in Spain that helped him learn about the Christian faith and brought him comfort. He contacted Radio Vida's social media page and talked with a counselor who shared about Jesus Christ. Ali shared that his father's health was failing. The counselor prayed with Ali, and his father experienced a miraculous healing. This led Ali to accept Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. He then delved deeper into learning more about Christ's love, redemption and new life. Ali says he is profoundly grateful to Jesus Christ and feels relief that he never felt before.







The Valley Fellowship of Christian Athletes

Our dollars invested for The Valley Fellowship of Christian Athletes are being well spent by introducing not only athletes but families of the athletes to the gospel of Christ. Over Christmas break the FCA team hosted a fun and energetic baseball camp for athletes grades 5 through 8 at O'Connor High School and a swim camp grades 6 through 12 at the Anthem Community Center. In early January the team hosted two football camps for athletes in grades 2 through 8, held at North Valley Christian Academy and Benjamin Franklin High School. These camps were well attended by a total of 132 students.



These camps provided a fantastic opportunity to connect new coaches with the athletes. Many new families were introduced to FCA and more importantly, the gospel of Jesus Christ. Each athlete left with a Bible, the FOUR bracelet, and a camp theme shirt. RO Residents Reach out to Community

Royal Oak residents gathered to fill fifty "Tiny Tot" Hope Bags for abused and underprivileged children here in Maricopa County. Who says we cannot contribute to others as we age, what a misnomer. One of the ladies is 101 years old, another 95 and let's just say most of us have reached the Platinum mark. These little bags filled with items the preschoolers at Neighborhood Ministries use in their school provides each child with dignity and respect as they are not only useful, but also include fun toys, such as the wooden toys made by our men in the Wood Butcher's Den. These men meet every week on Tuesday and Thursday morning from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 am and make the toys for the children. The men produce about 2200 of these wooden toys each year.







The Hope Bag Ministry of PWCC has supported Phoenix Dream Center for many years and through your loving contributions we are helping the children and women who are Human Traffick Survivors.
