SESSION TWO

HOW TO PRAY WITH CONFIDENCE

Jesus taught us to pray, "Our Father in heaven." One of the words in the Bible for "father" is "Abba," which simply means "daddy" or "papa." Abba is a term of endearment, love, intimacy, and security. Jesus was telling us that when you pray to God, you're talking to your Dad.

When you truly know and understand your heavenly Father, it will radically change your prayer life. It will enable you to pray with more confidence than ever before.

Daily Prayer Journal


