

Student Ministries Guidance for In-Person Ministry

As we begin in-person events in Student Ministries, we have been prayerfully and actively processing how to best keep all participants safe. This document is meant to show you what it will look like once your student comes back to ministry on campus.

Promotion of Healthy Behaviors

Staff and Volunteers:

- updated professionally led training that will teach sanitization methods and healthy habits
- a new commitment to enforcing safety measures at events
- temperature checks, verbal confirmation of no COVID-19 symptoms
- Face coverings are required and must be worn **at all times during events** (RHCC will have a limited supply)
- **A physical distancing of 6ft. is required at all times**

Students:

- a new check-in system that involves specific messaging which highlights expectations for students at each event
- verbal confirmation of no COVID-19 symptoms

Maintaining Healthy Environment

Before:

- new, posted **signage to remind students** of healthy hygiene
- CDC required **cleaning and sanitization of area for ministry**
- **health-screened volunteers**
- **clearly marked** drop-off/pick up zones, restrooms, student assigned areas, restricted areas, etc.

During:

- frequent hand-washing reminders
- games, lesson, small groups, and other ministry activities **designed to maintain 6ft. social distancing and face coverings**
- **no physical contact at all**
- no outside food allowed; the **ministry reserves** the right to provide self-contained snacks.

After: cleaning crew **sanitizes** area in accordance with CDC requirements.

Any student who is not complying with these guidelines will be asked to leave the event.

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In the Event of Someone Becoming Sick...

All staff, volunteers, and students are mandated to stay home if they have a fever or are feeling ill.

If a staff, volunteer, student, or someone in your household **tests positive for COVID-19** or **comes in contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19**,

1. Please notify Tiffany Adams first
2. HIPAA compliant communication will be sent to any persons who might have had exposure with affected person
3. those persons who were exposed will have to self-quarantine for 14 days before returning to the ministry

If a staff, volunteer, or student becomes symptomatic **at** a Student Ministries Event, the following steps will be taken:

1. They will be isolated and supervised as to not expose everyone else.
2. A family member or guardian must come and pick them up (in this event, please make every effort to do this as soon as possible)

RHCC has additional guidance for employees and visitors posted on campus to ensure the health and safety of all.
