It is important for us to occupy a spiritual space where we are able to come to grips with this reality. That moment in the apostles Creed reminds us that Jesus, "was crucified, dead, and buried." Christmas might make some sense without the season of Advent though I am glad we have it, but Easter would make no sense without Lent. It would mean ignoring the very confrontation with the principalities and powers of the world that occurs throughout Jesus' ministry, which is why he is put to death. It would mean ignoring the seeming victory of death, a victory that still seems very real to us today. Yet, we know through the witness of the church and through faith that death does not have the final say or victory.

I am glad we will experience this season together this year. I am glad and I rejoice that we will have more opportunities to be together in fellowship soon. Even as we join one another on this journey to the cross we know that we do not go on this journey alone. We do so as the church. We do so in the Power of the Spirit. We do so knowing that the journey Jesus is on is our journey, too. We do not back away or live in fear of displaying God's righteousness to the world. We recognize the full humanity and dignity of our neighbors, and we welcome the stranger. We do this because this is what Jesus did. It is risky, even dangerous, but it is good!

God is Self-Existent

God was under no constraint, no obligation, no necessity to create. That He chose to do so was purely a sovereign act on His part caused by nothing outside of Himself, determined by nothing but His own mere good pleasure. - A. W. Pink

Scripture Readings: Psalm 90:1-4; Romans 11:33-36; I Corinthians 8:5-6; Revelation 4:8One of the most difficult characteristics of God for human beings to come to understand is His aseity - self-existence. Unlike us, God has neither beginning nor end, and He is not dependent upon anyone or anything. God has always been in existence and has always ruled over His universe (Ps. 93:2). Because God is completely self-existent, He is not caused by or dependent upon anything outside Himself (John 5:26). Before the creation of time and space, the triune God existed eternally - satisfied in fellowship and delight with the three persons of the Trinity. God did not lack anything and was under no obligation or constraint to bring anything into existence. When God created, it was an act of love that displayed His majesty and glory.

As God's creatures, our physical life, spiritual life, and even eternal life all have Him as their source (Acts 17:28). All things are "from Him and through Him and to Him" (Rom. 11:36). Explained as follows:

- That all things are "from" God expresses that He is the source of all things.
- That all things are "through" God expresses that He is the means of all things.
- That all things are "to" God expresses that He is the goal of all things.

We are finite children of an infinite God – made to live in fellowship with Him. The great church father Augustine articulated this when he said, "Thou has made us for thyself O God, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in Thee." The greater our understanding of who God is, the more our own hearts become filled with contentment and satisfaction with Him.

Though we are insignificant in comparison to God, He invites us to bring all of our concerns to Him and trust Him in everything. Does God care about the small things in our lives or only the big things? When you think about it, compared to almighty God all things in our lives are small; yet, God invites us to come to Him anyway. Remember that God is all-sufficient, we can know that there is not a need in our lives that He cannot supply.

I'll conclude with some questions to ponder and discuss. Imagine that an unchurched friend asks you what you are learning from this article. How would you explain God's eternal and self-existent nature? Explain the statement "if anything exists, then something has always existed." What does this mean, and why is it important? Do you struggle with bringing "big" and "little" matters to God? How can a biblical understanding of God shape the way we present our needs and desires to God?


