God is Sovereign - Part 1

There is not one square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry: "Mine!" – Abraham Kuyper

Scripture Readings: Psalm 33:1-22; Psalm 93:1-5; Psalm 68:7-10; Ephesians 1:3-12; Prov. 21:1; Daniel 4: 1-37; Job 42:2; Luke 1:37; Hebrews 1:3; Romans 11:36; and Hebrews 1:1-4.

The sovereignty of God is a foundational cornerstone of Christian churches, especially the Presbyterian Church. Resounding throughout the pages of Scripture is the proclamation that God is King of Kings and Lord of Lords! When we say God is sovereign, we are ascribing to Him a rule and authority that transcends space and time, with nothing outside its scope. There are no "maverick molecules" to quote RC Sproul. God's sovereignty ought to provide comfort to believers facing adversity and instill awe in the face of His limitless power.

God guides and directs both the macro-story - the movement of human history - and our micro-stories - each of our individual lives; everything happens in accordance with His plan. God is unfolding His-story which involves salvation of his people for his glory by focusing on his son, Jesus. How God works in both the macro and micro stories has been expressed through the idea of providence. Describing providence, The Westminster Confession of Faith 5.1 states:

God the creator of all things doth uphold, direct, dispose, and govern all creatures, actions, and things, from the greatest even to the least, by his most wise and holy providence, according to his infallible foreknowledge and the free and immutable counsel of his own will, to the praise of the glory of his wisdom, power, justice, goodness, and mercy.

God is bound to and involved with his creation. He loves his creation. He upholds the universe by the power of his Word (Heb. 1:3). In him all things hold together and the world would cease to exist if he ever stopped doing so. He directs history so that in the fullness of time he sent forth his son (Gal. 4:4). God disposed events to turn out a certain way according to his perfect and secret plan. He chose Isaac, not Ishmael; Jacob, not Esau; Moses, not Aaron. God disposed that Pharaoh would react in certain ways to demonstrate who was the true God. God governs both living creatures and inanimate objects.

Our future does not rest in the hands of human beings. Our destiny does not depend upon blind chance or luck. Rather, God is actively involved in our lives, directing them according to his holy purposes. Yes, we know that evil exists and Satan has great power, but it is nothing compared to the might of our almighty Lord. As Christians we realize that our lives and human history have both a purpose and direction. It is the big story God is working out. He is guiding human history to a specific goal: the full and final salvation and liberation of his people and his creation (Romans 8:18–30).

How does a high view of God as King of Kings keep us from relying on our own works? Considering God's sovereignty, how do you or others speak about him, understand him, and live your lives?

FIDGET BLANKET NEEDS

The Bethany Mission Team is on a mission. We are working to create fidget blankets through this mission of love to keep the hands and minds of patients going through Dementia and Alzheimer's busy.

If you search on the internet you can see thousands of ideas. Some of the items needed for Fidget Blankets are as follows: fleece and flannel materials, large buttons, appliques, ribbon and rickrack (different widths), plastic beads, keychain rings, zippers, belts, colorful shoelaces, ties etc. Just about anything can be used in some manner so look through those closets and see what you can find. As long as it can go into the washer and dryer, it can be used!

These blankets are an approximate finished size of 16" x 20" and are for the residents in the memory unit at Country Meadows.

"This mission is very near and dear to our hearts for many reasons. A dear friend of mine has Dementia and I have had other friends who have had loved ones diagnosed with Dementia or Alzheimer's," said Connie Segeleon, Mission Team member. "My daddy passed away from Alzheimer's and I only wished I had known about the fidget blankets back then as he would have loved one, so my first blanket was dedicated to him, with his favorite colors."

We can all be a part of this mission and you do not have to know how to sew using a machine. Beads can be strung, and buttons sewed on ribbons as well as the blankets themselves. The Mission Team is also accepting donations of Joanne Fabrics gift cards to purchase supplies. For those who knit or crochet, blankets can be made from yarn or hand muffs and others can sew items on them as well. Anyone is welcome to join us and be a part of something truly awesome.
