God is Sovereign - Part 2

As many of you know, my mother recently passed away. However, what she taught me will never pass-away. At a young age she taught me about the sovereignty of God in salvation. I did not understand it at the time, but I remembered her words. She said, "If you become a Christian, know that God chooses you, you did not choose Him." On another occasion, I was reminded that predestination and election are why a neighbor diligently worshiped, prayed and served her church – even though the woman said she did not believe in predestination and election! I didn't understand that either!



Predestination and election (God choosing) have caused confusion and misunderstanding particularly in these present times. I'll try to clarify! In a broad sense, election refers to God choosing to do everything that He does in whatever way He sees fit. He has a predetermined plan. He acts according to His good pleasure and nature. He does what He does without influence or constraint from any outside influence.

The Bible repeatedly makes the above points clear. In creation, God created precisely what He wanted (Gen. 1:31). He prescribed and permitted everything in human history in order to accomplish redemption for His people (Isa. 25:1; 46:10; 55.11; Rom. 9:17; Eph. 3:8-11). In the OT, He chose a nation for Himself. Out of all the nations in the world, He selected Israel (Deut. 7:6; 14:2; Ps. 105:43; 135:4).

In the NT, Jesus Christ is called "My chosen One" (Luke 9:35). NT believers are called "God's Chosen Ones" (Col. 3:12; 1 Cor. 1:27; 2 Thess. 2:13; 2 Tim. 2:10; Titus 1:1; 1 Peter 1:1; 2:9; Rev. 17:14). When Jesus told His disciples, "You did not choose me, but I chose you" (John 15:16), He was underscoring this truth. Predestination refers specifically to salvation. God choosing whom He will save. It is God's determination in eternity past to save His chosen people. Ephesians 1:4-6 notes that God "chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. In love He predestined us for adoption through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace, with which He has blessed us in the Beloved." See also Rom. 8:28–30 (aka God's Golden Chain of Salvation); 1 Thess. 1:4; 2 Thess. 2:13; Acts 13:48; 1 Pet. 2:4–10; Rom. 9:14–29.

The Word of God presents God as controller and disposer of all creatures (Dan.4:35; Isa. 45:7; Lam. 3:38). God is ruler of heaven and earth (Gen. 14:19; Isa.37:16) and works all things according to the counsel of His will (Eph. 1:11; Isa. 14:27; Rev. 19:6). He is the heavenly Potter who shapes men according to His own good pleasure (Rom. 9:18–22). In short, God decides and determines every man's destiny and controls every detail in each individual's life (Prov. 16:9; 19:21; 21:1; Ex. 3:21–22; 14:8; Ezra 1:1; Dan. 1:9; James 4:15). This is God being God!

Many more scriptures could be added. Still, people continually have difficulty with predestination and election. Perhaps they have a preconceived notion about how God will act? Do they think their will is outside of God's sovereignty? Do they have God choosing them based on their choosing God? How does our fallen nature play into this?

Consider this revelation which helped me personally with predestination and election. Simply put, no man or committee of men would have originated these doctrines. They must have come from God! Thus, learning to love and embrace them has become foundational to my understanding of the Bible, and has enhanced my love for God. This is an executive summary of a weighty topic. 
