# God is Holy

When the Bible calls God holy, it means primarily that God is transcendent and separate. He is far above and beyond us that He seems almost totally foreign to us. - R.C. Sproul Scripture Readings: Exodus 15:11; Isaiah 6:1-7

Have you ever entered an empty sanctuary, perhaps mid-week, when no one is there, and quietly prayed? I try to do that once or twice a year. You can just shut out all the noise and distractions and just be with your Lord in prayer and meditation. It is such a different realm. At least for me there is a small glimpse of God's holiness in that place and moment. Is holiness a foreign concept to you? Perhaps this article and the referenced scriptures will instill a sense of awe toward God who is holy and exalted over all creation. May it also move us toward a more reverent worship desired by God. The church is strongest when it recognizes and honors the holiness of God.

The Bible repeatedly describes people, places, and things associated with God as "holy." In Isaiah 6 heavenly beings continuously cry out "Holy, holy, holy!" The threepeat of holy elevates God to a superlative degree and honors him above all else. Scripture speaks of God's sovereignty, love, truth and other attributes, but only his holiness is presented in a trifold repetition!

The Hebrew word translated into English as "holy" primarily indicates separation or the act of setting apart. God is distinctly and infinitely superior to His creation and His creatures. Scriptures (Ex. 15:11; Ps. 22:3) ascribe kingly majesty to God. However, His splendor vastly exceeds that of exalted human monarchs and His glory is too stunning for humans to behold or comprehend.

In Isaiah 6:1-7 God's holiness is described dramatically. The dazzling seraphim - blazing in their intensity for God's glory - must cover themselves in the presence of God's splendor. Overwhelmed by God's holiness, Isaiah becomes "undone" and profoundly aware of his own unclean and unworthy nature.

It is important to understand God's holiness means He is morally perfect. God is pure without sin or blemish. God's judgements and decisions are perfect. As a perfect and holy being, God is not neutral toward good or evil. God loves what is true, worthy and righteous. He cannot tolerate sin. In the presence of such a holy God we will be like Isaiah – undone, unclean and unworthy. Oh, but there is a cure! Through the righteousness of Jesus Christ, Isaiah and guilty sinners like us, can one day be reconciled to a holy, holy, holy God.

## God's Word to You!

Hebrews 1:1-3 speaks to us. "God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in HIS Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom He also made the world. And He is the radiance of His glory and the exact representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power. Study notes about this passage suggest that this opening verse of Hebrews was one majestic sentence in the Greek, that "in last days" refers to the entire gospel from the first to the second advent of Christ, and "radiance" means "an outshining." These expressions are strong assertions about the deity of Christ. (NAS, Ryrie Study Bible). God tells us that His revelation comes to us in three ways:

- 1. The first is that Jesus Christ is the perfect and primary revelation of God. Everything we know about our heavenly Father is experienced in His Son, Jesus Christ. This is not about physical characteristics as God is Spirit (John 4:24) but is about who God is.
- 2. The second revelation of God is Holy Scripture. From the first word of Genesis to the last word of Revelation, the Bible bears witness to Jesus Christ.
- 3. The third revelation of God is the proclamation of the Church, when that proclamation is biblical.

So, we must take this personally! God has revealed Godself to you! Read the Bible as if God has sent it to you personally! Then read it again, as every time we do, more is revealed to us. It is God's way of teaching us how much he loves us, how to order our lives for HIS blessings, and how to grow our faith and pray to become holy enough (sanctified) to be pleasing to God Who saves us.
