Soul-winning alone vs. Making disciples Jesus way

Suppose a soul-winner won 1000 people to Christ every day. At the end of the first year there would be 365, 000 new believers! Suppose another person led one person to Christ and spent that year building, teaching, and training that individual to grow to maturity (edification) and to give witness of his faith and build up others. At the end of the first year, those engaged in a discipling ministry would number two. If this process were to continue indefinitely, with the soul-winner "adding" and the discipler "multiplying" each year, the total number of converts when compared at later dates would reveal the following:

Every true believer will have a sincere desire for the lost to be saved. Therefore, every Christian should be passionate about winning souls. Most Baptist churches today emphasize soul winning, but do not have a plan to make disciples; hence the pastor and his wife, with some faithful leaders, do **all** the work.
