1.	Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2.	Much like the people of Jabesh Gilead, we may often feel like we have no other choice but to compromise in order to keep our freedom. How should we respond when in situations like this?
3.	What would have/could have happened had God's people given themselves into the hands of the Ammonites? Compare this with the consequences that occur when we give in to sin. What can be the long-lasting effects of sin in our lives?
4.	What differences might we expect to see between endeavoring to do something in our own strength (training, experience) and doing it in the strength the Lord provides? How can we know the difference between operating in our strength and operating in the power He gives?
5.	What does verse 7 say about how God's people responded to Saul's rallying cry? What parallels can we draw from this regarding how we as brothers and sisters in Christ are to respond in times of threat or crisis?
6.	God used this time of crisis to confirm His ordination of Saul as king. How has God used a time of crisis in your life to bring confirmation that He was active and working in your life? To draw you further into His will?
