5.	The many needs around us are actually an! (Deuteronomy 15:11; Proverbs 22:9; Luke 6:38; Philippians 2:4; 1 Peter 3:15; 2 Timothy 4:2)
6.	When Jesus asks for laborers to go out, may I be quick to! (Isaiah 6:8; Ezekiel 22:30; John 20:21)
7.	We have freely received so much from God. May we take what we have received from Him and be willing to it to others. (Deuteronomy 6:10-15; 2 Corinthians 9:6-15; Proverbs 11:25; Leviticus 25:35-37; Psalm 41:1-3; Luke 6:37-38)
