1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2. God spoke to Abram and told him to GO...Leave your home for a place you do not know, but with the promise that I will do great things. "*So Abram went...*" (**Gen.12:4**). In what way(s) might God be asking you to "Go" right now that you are resisting?
3. Joseph's brother - in anger, hatred, and jealousy - had sold him into slavery. Many years later, Joseph shared with his then-fearful brothers (**Gen. 50:20**), "*you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as it is this day, to save many people alive.*" How have you seen God work in this same kind of way recently through not-so-good circumstances? In what present circumstances do you desire to see God work similarly?
4. God had just rescued His people from 400 years of slavery, spared them from death, and was delivering them into a land that would be theirs. "*Israel saw the great power that the LORD used against the Egyptians, so the people feared the LORD...*" (Ex.14:31). Yet in a matter of moments, they began to grumble and say they were 'better off' back in Egypt. Given that Egypt is a picture of sin/the world, in what ways are we tempted to 'go back' to the old man/woman/way of life? What must we do to combat this faulty thinking?
5. Using one of our 10 points from Sunday (relative to seeing Jesus in the Scriptures), share how you could use that as a starting point to share the gospel with someone.
