The Bible teaches us in Proverbs 22:6 to 'Train them up in the way they should go and when they are old they won't depart from it.' I have seen this in so many situations when kids may go off on the wrong path but those raised in Christ, always come back to the truth. The Bible instructs us on the importance of discipline (Proverbs 12:1) and teaching our children about what is most important in this life. It teaches them how to treat someone who doesn't treat them well (Luke 6:31) and gives them guidance in hard situations (Joshua 1:9). As parents, we tend to get overwhelmed rather than realizing we have the answers for every parenting situation in the Bible."
