## Reverend Ronald L. Sparks



Rev. Ronald L. Sparks is a native of Toledo, OH. Immediately after graduating from high school, Rev. Sparks enlisted into the United States Air Force. He was honorably discharged after serving six years. Rev. Sparks is married to his life partner and best friend Candace M. Sparks. They have been blessed with three wonderful children, Cameron, Symone, and Braedon. In 2020, Rev. Sparks and Sister Candace became grandparents as they welcomed Shaelyn Alexandra Sparks to the family.

Reverend Sparks holds a Bachelor of Science Degree, Business Management, from the University of Maryland University College. He received his Master of Divinity, Drew University Theological School

Rev. Sparks accepted his call to ministry in 1997 and was mentored by his father in the ministry, Rev. Dr. Kenneth L. Saunders, former Pastor of North Stelton AME Church in Piscataway, NJ. In 1998, Rev. Sparks received his first ordination as an Itinerate Deacon and in April 2001 he received his second ordination as an Itinerate Elder. In 2005, Rev. Sparks began his pastoral ministry at St. Paul AME Church in South Bound Brook, NJ. Currently Rev. Sparks serves as the Pastor of Bethel AME Church in Freehold NJ.
