

SERMON INTRO:

In the book of Leviticus, God presents His people with instructions for various feasts and celebrations to mark their year. God called the Israelites to celebrate with each other: to be joyous and to remember their Creator. The festivals God ordained for the Israelites remind us that God provides for us and point us to characteristics of God. Part of God's call on His people is to engage in joyous celebration.

Jesus people are party people. We celebrate the way the disciples celebrated after the resurrection -- the way that people who know the Good News celebrate. We actively enjoy the blessings God has provided and share them with our brothers and sisters. By celebrating with each other, we remind each other of God's promises and provision in our lives and share echoes of the spiritual wedding feast that awaits us in heaven.
