### **3/28 Palm Sunday**

Luke 19:29-31: "When he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village in front of you, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say this: 'The Lord has need of it.'"

Lord, sometimes faithfulness looks like obedience when it doesn't make sense to us. Help us to be like these disciples and trust you at your word and do what you would ask of us. Amen.

### **3/29**

Luke 19:32-35: "So those who were sent went away and found it just as he had told them. And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?" And they said, "The Lord has need of it." And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it."

Lord Jesus, you knew that this triumphal entry would lead to the cross and yet you were obedient to the wishes of the Father, and out of your great love for all of us, you didn't merely submit to the cross, you chose it for us. Thank you Jesus. We are undeserving, but so appreciative of your sacrificial love. Amen.

### **3/30**

Luke 19:36-38: "And as he rode along, they spread their cloaks on the road. As he was drawing near—already on the way down the Mount of Olives—the whole multitude of his disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, saying, 'Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!'"

Lord, thank you for sending your Son. He came as a King, but not the King that we expected, and while we often, even in our modern days, will praise His name, we often can get frustrated with how He's called us to live, self-sacrificially as He did. Help us to submit our hearts and our lives to you, King Jesus. Amen.

### **3/31**

Luke 19:39-40: "And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, rebuke your disciples.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out.'"

King Jesus! Our King and our Lord! We praise you along with creation for all that you are, all that you've done, and all that you will do! We love you! We praise you! Amen!

#### **4/1 Maundy Thursday**

Luke 22:14-23: "When the hour came, Jesus and his apostles reclined at the table. And he said to them, 'I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfillment in the kingdom of God.' After taking the cup, he gave thanks and said, 'Take this and divide it among you. For I tell you I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.' And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you. But the hand of him who is going to betray me is with mine on the table. The Son of Man will go as it has been decreed. But woe to that man who betrays him!' They began to question among themselves which of them it might be who would do this."

#### **4/2 Good Friday**

Luke 22: 44-46: "It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' When he had said this, he breathed his last."

#### **4/3**

Luke 23:50-56: "Now there was a man named Joseph, a member of the Council, a good and upright man, who had not consented to their decision and action. He came from the Judean town of Arimathea, and he himself was waiting for the kingdom of God. Going to Pilate, he asked for Jesus' body. Then he took it down, wrapped it in linen cloth and placed it in a tomb cut in the rock, one in which no one had yet been laid. It was Preparation Day, and the Sabbath was about to begin. The women who had come with Jesus from Galilee followed Joseph and saw the tomb and how his body was laid in it. Then they went home and prepared spices and perfumes. But they rested on the Sabbath in obedience to the commandment."

#### **4/4 Easter**

Luke 24: 1-6 24: "On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!'"

Christ the Lord is risen today! Hallelujah!!!
