Mark 1:12-15: "At once the Spirit sent him out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him. After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!"

Lord Jesus, how wonderful is it to know that you have been tempted in every way just as we are. You know what it is like to feel loss, sorrow, hurt, pain, fear, and anxiety. You were tempted as we are to alleviate these woes in ways that will ultimately not satisfy, but you kept your focus on the Father. Help us to do the same. Amen.

Matthew 4:11: "Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.'" Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him."
