Monday, September 13	"eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—" Ephesians 4:3-4
	Lord, may we be eager to maintain the unity of your Spirit, keeping in peace. Remind us that we are unified in you-one body with one Spirit. Amen. (A prayerful reflection on the unified church)
Tuesday, September 14	"one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." Ephesians 4:5-6
	Lord Jesus, for all the division we see in your body every day, remind us that we serve one King, we have one faith, we are baptized under one Lord, God, and Father of all. Help us to act accordingly. Amen. (A prayerful reflection on the unified church)
Wednesday, September 15	"But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift." Ephesians 4:7
	Father, it takes humility for us to be reminded that we are in deep need, every single day of forgiveness. Help us to remember our need for grace and to extend that grace to others. Amen. (A prayerful reflection on the unified church)
Thursday, September 16	Therefore it says, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men." (In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower regions, the earth? He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.)". Ephesians 4:8-10
