## **APPLICATION QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Read Genesis 2:5-9. In these verses we are introduced to a barren landscape of dirt and rock that is devoid of life. But God breathes into the lifeless dirt to create life. This is a fundamental image in the Bible, that God's personal life-giving presence is what sustains all living creatures. Apart from God's own life-presence, there is only disorder and death. But when God's Spirit is in the mix, the impossible suddenly becomes possible and life can come from non-life. God's lifegiving Spirit is the one who provides and sustains life in the world. Where do you see life emerging and flourishing around you?
- 2. The Spirit is in the business of breathing life where there is hopelessness. Where do you sense a need for new life in or around you?
- 3. In Acts 2 we see the Holy Spirit come upon the disciples in a powerful way (kinda reminds me of Jesus' baptism). What is Luke trying to make connections with in his description of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles? What allusions to the Old Testament do you see? Why would he make these allusions? Why is this transition so important for the life of the church (and us as individual believers within this church/body)?
- How would you describe being "filled by the Spirit" in your own experience walking with Jesus?
- How has the Spirit empowered you recently?
