The most important day of your life...

I recently read an article about the 10 most important days in history. It was a very interesting read. But it got me to thinking about how perspective plays into their "top 10" and did those 10 days really affect me personally?

Then I began to ponder what my personal top 10 days would be, days that changed the trajectory of my life. Of course, my Salvation would be #1. The day I married Molli. The day I surrendered to full time Christian service. The day I joined this wonderful church to serve our Lord and you. Then I interrupted my top 10 list to then think about how even those 4 things changed my life.

Last December, Brother John called to update me on the interview process. He didn't realize when he called, I was quite sick with covid and on my way to the ER. He told me he would pray. It was in that moment, God spoke to my heart that one day He would lead me to Terrell. You guys have my heart. I have prayed for you long before you knew my name. It is an honor to work alongside you. This church is a blessing. You have changed my life.



What about Jesus?

WHY IS CHRISTMAS A BIG DEAL FOR CHRISTIANS?

John 3:16, that is why.

This is the most well- known verse in the Bible. It sums up what it is all about. Christmas celebrates the beginning of our HOPE IN JESUS. Christmas begins our story in Jesus.

Want to share the Gospel in a quick and unique way?

Ask someone you come in contact with if they have ever heard the Christmas story in 1 sentence?
They will likely say they have not.
Quote John 3:16.
Then read their reaction and go from there. God will lead you how and what to say.

If you are not a Christian:

The Bible is God's word, literally. It is God speaking to you and to me. In the Bible, in the book of John, chapter 3, verse 16 it says: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

God is saying here that He loves you and He wants a relationship with you. Who is he saying this to? The entire human race. You may say but you don't understand, I am not a good person- God loves you and wants you. You say I have abandoned my marriage- God loves you and wants you. You say I have a problem with addictions that control me- God loves you and wants you. You say that I have anger or anxiety or depression- God loves you and wants you. He knows you and He loves you and wants you, regardless of any fault.

You want proof of that? Look at the next phrase- He sent His only begotten Son. God sent Jesus to come to the earth, to live a sinless life. Jesus went to the cross willingly to pay the punishment for your sins and mine. The Bible teaches us that Jesus rose from the dead on the 3rd day and went back to Heaven with God.

By nature, we are sinners and don't deserve to be in God's Holy presence. He loves you and made a way for a relationship with you. But you have to receive the gift by believing in Him and by doing so you will not perish. What does that mean? Perish means to be separated from God. One day you will stand before God. If you have believed on Him and asked Him to be your Savior, you will live with Him in Heaven. If you have not believed on Him, your rejection alone will send you to an eternity in Hell.

There isn't a magical formula and certain words that must be said. It is simple as ABC

Admit to God you are a sinner

Believe that Jesus is Lord, that He came and died on the cross for your sins

Confess your sins to God and ask Him to be your Savior.

If you have just prayed this prayer, stop what you are doing now and contact us and tell us that you prayed and say "now what?". We will guide you how to live a full life in Jesus.

Growing up, we got all kinds of presents, but there was always one "BIG present". Something we usually longed for and that would rock our world.

Kids are fun to watch at Christmas. There is excitement in giving a gift that you know they are going to love and an amazement that has no words to describe when they choose to miss the "big present" and play with the box that it came in instead. As adults, we can miss our "big present" too...

Jeremiah 9:23-24 Thus says the Lord, "Let not a wise man boast of his wisdom, and let not the mighty man boast of his might, let not a rich man boast of his riches; 24 but let him who boasts boast of this, that he understands and knows Me, that I am the Lord who exercises lovingkindness, justice and righteousness on earth; for I delight in these things," declares the Lord.

How do we "know" God?
Pursue Jesus with all of
your heart.
Wake up, read your Bible,
sit in His presence and
listen for Him speaking
to your heart.
