We think we have life figured out. We develop a plan, it sounds logical. And boom, it changes on a dime.

Life can be uncertain and scary. Whether you are a 3 yr old afraid of a costume, someone facing health issues, or financial woes. It just doesn't seem to stop. Just look at the headlines any day of the week and it is always something to add to our crazy, mixed up world.

I am sure that many of us thought that covid would be a distant memory by now. Yet, it is still a disruption. Add in a earthquake or two, civil unrest, natural disasters, world conflict, things are a mess!

How do we cope when life feels heavy? What are we supposed to do with the disappointments and hardships in our lives?

Look up....

We live in uncertain times, but we need to realize that we are standing on a firm foundation. When we feel the weight of the world on our shoulders, we need to examine our hearts to find out why we feel afraid or discouraged. While things feel uncertain, God is the same. You survived every hard day you have ever had because of the grace and mercy of our Lord.

Write a list of ways God has been faithful to you. Refer to them when you are having a hard day. Recently, I was thinking about 2021. While covid dominates headlines every day, I was thinking about the winter storm in February. We had a 1 mo old baby in our home and heating was our concern. God provided our needs but also allowed us to help some friends of ours that were without power and had a 3 mo old baby. So we hunkered down with 4 adults, 2 tiny babies and a few dogs in our little home. While each minute ahead was uncertain and could produce anxiety, we choose to focus on God's faithfulness in the moment.

God is working, even when we can't see it.

When something doesn't happen as we had envisioned or in a timing that seems wrong to us, it doesn't mean that God has forgotten about us.

The Bible tells us that our knowledge is limited, but God's wisdom and power is unlimited. We can't understand God's ways because we don't see what God sees and know what God knows. I don't know about you, but I am very content serving a God with higher thinking than I am capable of.

God has a plan, and it is good.

It can be hard to truly believe this in the midst of trouble. Whenever I hit on hard times, I ask the Lord to use this trial for good. I have come to realize that the good might be for my benefit, or it may be for someone else. Hard times aren't necessarily a punishment to me, maybe it will encourage another in their walk. So I have learned to say "If not me, who for?" Ask the Lord to use your difficulties in life to help others. It will be a blessing to you as well as strengthen your faith.

What would happen

if we realized the true power of prayer? That prayer changes lives and situations? Would we be more intent in our prayer life?

Will you take 1 minute every day and ask the Lord to help you demonstrate the hope of Jesus in this lost world, especially in the city of Terrell?

MEMORY VERSE TIME

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! 5 Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near. 6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:4-7

Verse 4:

Rejoice- to be happy, to be glad. In the Lord- This takes all of the responsibility of your trouble and leaving it in God's hands.

So we are not rejoicing in what we can do, but what God can do.

Verse 5:

Don't allow your uncertainties to affect your character: kindness, goodness, gentleness

> Our character should be shown to everyone, regardless of our circumstances.

Verse 6:

Don't waste your time and energy worrying about uncertainties, but praying what your true concerns are to God. Go beyond "Help!" Tell Him why you need something or have fear. It will reveal a lot to you and God will enjoy you sharing your heart.

Verse 7:

The peace of God that Paul is referring to is a peace that isn't logical. Your circumstances haven't changed, your heart has. This peace will guard your heart and keep your circumstances from controlling your emotions.

WHAT A PROMISE!!

This is an excellent verse for your entire family to memorize.

BIBLE STORY



It is interesting that the Bible is filled with stories from long ago. The stories aren't simple, feel good stories that aren't important. They are about people who faced uncertain times and challenges to teach us and encourage us in the world we live in today!

We can be encouraged by them, and learn from them. Remember that we too are examples for others around us in how we live and act.

This month, I would like for you to pick the story for your family. Pick your favorite Bible character. Many have overcome uncertain times in their life. Find the story in the Bible and read aloud with your family.

Discussion questions

- 1.What was the uncertainty in their life?
- 2. How do you think they felt?
- 3. How did God handle their problem?
- 4. What would you have done in their situation?
- 5. How can I apply that to our life now?

The common theme in all of the stories of the Bible is that Jesus is the answer. He is the one who makes our life complete. The Bible teaches us that He is always with us. One of my favorite stories is about Abraham. He had many times of uncertainty and waiting. And in God's time, He provided for Abraham.

Discuss:

Object lesson:

Look down at your hands and wiggle them. How does your hands help you during the day? Eating, dressing, throwing a ball, texting, writing, mom/dad holding a baby, etc.. Hands can be very helpful. The Bible teaches us that we can be the hands of God by helping others.

Take a paper plate and put it on the top of your head. With a marker and without peeking, draw a house, a heart and a dog. Now look at your pictures. Probably looks a little silly, huh? Now lets do it again but have a helper stand by you and guide your hands. How did the pictures turn out this time?

God guides us and helps us know what to do. We can hold His hand and let Him help us every day. He can also use others in our lives to help us in times of need.
