SMALL GROUP GUIDE

1. WELCOME

If anyone has had a significant event in their life this past week, give them a minute to share with the group. If necessary, take some time to pray for any immediate needs right at the beginning of the meeting.

2. VISION/PURPOSE

How is everyone in the group doing? Are there any needs that we can accommodate? Is there anyone that we need to follow up with or check in on?

3. SMALL GROUP GUIDELINES

Review guidelines (Use "I" Statements, No Fixing, Confidentiality, Listening) that cultivate a healthy environment for sharing and discussion.

4. OPENING PRAYER

5. READ SCRIPTURE PASSAGE/TELL BIBLE STORY PASSAGE

6. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Use a good mix of Head (informational/study) questions, Heart (personal reflection) questions, and Hand (practical application) questions. Below are questions your group can pick from to follow along with the sermon series.

7. PERSONAL SHARING AND PRAYER REQUESTS

You can share and pray in one group, in smaller groups, or in gender specific groups. Make sure that phone numbers are shared so that encouragement and connection can happen during the week.

QUESTIONS

WARM UP: Describe a challenge you have faced, pressed into and didn't give up.

HEAD: These questions help us examine the Word.

1. Review Joshua 12 and summarize the victories described.
2. What is significant about Joshua 13:1 (What had they accomplished, and what was yet to be accomplished?)
3. Read Joshua 14:6-12
 - o Who was Caleb, what do you know about him?
 - o Why are he and Joshua significant as men of faith in Israel's history?
 - o What is Caleb's request in chapter 14?

HEART: These questions help us wrestle with what we believe.

4. Talk as a group about spiritual apathy or laziness. What makes you satisfied with the status quo, and why would you stay there? What are the excuses that tend to cripple your growth?
5. When you think of a passion for Jesus that pushes and drives you forward, how do you nurture or grow that passion?
6. Should a disciple ever be satisfied? (Think through Philippians 3:10-14)

HAND:

7. How can you be aware of spiritual apathy or blind spots? (Psalm 139:23-24, Proverbs 27:17)
8. God is always drawing you deeper into the life and fullness of Christ. How do you practically respond to His pursuit of you?
9. What is on your spiritual bucket list?
