# **Pastor's Page**

Most of you probably realize that I write each of these Tacklebox letters a couple of weeks before you see them, so that the newsletter can be edited, printed, assembled and mailed. With that in mind, I thought you might find it interesting that I'm writing this particular article on Friday the 13th. That's right, Friday the 13th of 2020. What could go wrong, right?

I know we're all ready for 2020 to be over. We have Covid-fatigue. We have election-fatigue. We're just flat out fatigued in general at this point. I feel it too. But in the midst of this fatigue, this weariness created by a very difficult year, I'm reminded of Jesus' words in Matthew when he says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. <sup>29</sup> Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. <sup>30</sup> For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30) I can't tell you how much I need to hear that right now. And I'm sure many of you feel the same. So I invite you to just pause here for a moment. Read those words again. Let them wash over you. Allow them to penetrate deep into your soul. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you truly experience this promise in the midst of a difficult season in life.

Do you already feel the burden being lifted? I pray that you do. In fact, I pray that your burden not only be lifted, but that it be taken away completely. But for that to happen, you'll need to keep your eyes fixed on Jesus and trust daily (every hour, every minute and every second) in all of his promises. To help you do that, we're going to spend the next couple of months or so focusing on the incredible love of God poured out to us through Jesus.

We'll start with our Advent series entitled "A Savior is Born." This RightNow Media driven series will take us deeply into God's love and presence as we delve into God's plan of salvation through Christ. We'll look back to the Old Testament and see how God's plan was already working long before anyone ever realized it. We'll look at the people God worked in and through as part of Jesus' lineage. As we get to know some of these folks in a more intimate way, the vastness of God's love will become quite apparent.

Then, in January, we'll likely still be dealing with Covid as well as political/election issues, so we're going to do a deep dive into Psalm 23. We'll spend six weeks unpacking this beloved Psalm with the help of a RightNow Media series. I pray that we find great comfort and rest for our burdened and weary souls as we spend quality time with the Good Shepherd. Again, we'll be reminded of the vastness of God's love for each and every one of us.

You'll find more information on each of these studies further back in this newsletter (p. 9 & 10). I pray that you'll participate fully in each series, not only on Sunday mornings, but with your small groups and even spending some additional devotional time on your own as well. The more you put into them, the more you'll get out of them. The more you focus on Jesus, the lighter your burdens and the more complete your joy. And what more joyful season is there than this?





# **Advent Sermon Series**



# Advent Sermon Series and Community Group Study

It is one of the most familiar stories in human history: the birth of Jesus in a lowly manger in Bethlehem. A Savior, which is Christ the Lord. Yet, how can we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of our Savior in our frantic, consumer-driven society? How do we make sure the Christmas holiday remains a Holy Day?

In each of the four sessions of this RightNow Media video Advent study, viewers will experience short films that capture events surrounding the prophecy, lineage and birth of Jesus Christ. The sermon series began November 29 and continues for four Sundays throughout the Advent season.

# New Sermon Series Beginning January 10

There's no doubt that 2020 has been a difficult year. It's been quite exhausting. The combination of Covid-19, racial strife, and an election unlike anything we've seen before in our lifetimes, has left many of us longing for better days ahead. And I'm sure those better days are coming, but maybe not as quickly as we'd like. Even so, God still offers us Hope, Peace, Love and Joy regardless of our circumstances.

King David may have understood this Biblical truth more than anyone. I think this is what he was writing about in Psalm 23. I know you are probably all very familiar with Psalm 23. But because it is so familiar, we often breeze through it without slowing down long enough to rest in the assurance it offers. So to help us start 2021 off right, we're going to embark on a six-week sermon series and small group study on "Psalm 23." We'll be using Pastor Matt Chandler's RightNow Media study as our guide. Pastor Chandler will introduce us to the great shepherd, the Lord, who promises to provide for every need of his flock. Though only six verses long, this psalm teaches us profound truths about our loving and protective God. By engaging in a deeper study of Psalm 23, we'll receive the life-transforming assurance that enables us to trust in the Lord in all circumstances.

The series will begin on Sunday, January 10 and run thru Sunday, February 14, taking us right up to Lent. Study guides will be available for small groups and the videos are on RightNow Media.



# Why is there a dog in church and what does she do?

If you have been around the church lately you have probably seen our new 4-legged staff member and *therapy dog,* Tolin roaming around. But what exactly is a therapy dog and what do they do?

According to the AKC, therapy dogs are dogs who go with their owners to volunteer in settings such as schools, hospitals and nursing homes. From working with a child who is learning to read to visiting a senior in assisted living, therapy dogs and their owners work together as a team to improve the lives of other people. According to the Mayo Clinic, animal-assisted therapy can reduce pain and anxiety in people with a range of health problems. There are many good resources for the benefits of pet therapy from many reputable sources that speak to the positive outcome of animals visiting. Therapy dogs are being used in hospitals, nursing homes, schools, libraries, courtrooms, homeless shelters and many other places.

With Covid, our ability to visit has been limited, but Tolin does come to church with us to bring joy and unconditional love to people. The kids get so excited to see the dog on Sundays and Wednesdays. In fact, the one time I left her home, I was in big trouble! Some kids cannot wait to come to church just to see Tolin. Other kids take her for a walk up and down the hallway and then they go to class without any other issues. When we have a child who is having a rough time, we can take them in the hall and they can sit and pet and talk to Tolin. It has been incredible to see how kids respond and relax with Tolin around.

As I have been studying and looking at the theology of pet-based therapy, I have come to the conclusion that pet therapy starts in the Old Testament, in the story of Balaam and his donkey in Numbers 22. Balaam is on his way and the Lord is angry with him and sends an angel to oppose him. Balaam doesn't see the angel, but the donkey does. Three times the donkey protects Balaam from the angel, but Balaam didn't understand and beat the donkey until finally, the Lord "opened the donkey's mouth." The entire time the donkey saw the problem and was working to protect its owner from harm. It was because of the donkey that Balaam escaped harm.

This is one of the ways that animal therapy helps. Animals sometimes sense the stress, anxiety, or fear in a person and provide comfort, love, and presence. Animals can sometimes "see" our feelings and help us to process them by simply being present. Humans are judgmental, no matter how hard we try not to be, and when you're sick, stressed, or just trying to process life, pets won't judge you, and they will be there for you unconditionally.

If you feel called by God to explore how you and your pet can serve in this exciting ministry of offering help, offering hope, and offering Jesus through your pet, please see Pastor Matt. It isn't hard to get started. If your pet is well behaved and enjoys being around others, you are most of the way there!


