Kids learn how the Doodad of the Day relates to the objective and how they can live out God's Word. There are keys to find, chests to open, and the silly and wise Professor Sock, who helps decode the mystery of each lesson's Bible Story cartoon. After the video, there are group activities to round out the lesson and a map book for the children to take home each week.

Explorers & Pathfinders, Children Kindergarten-2nd Grade and 3rd-4th Grade


