Pastor's Page

I'm pretty excited about our current sermon series, "Reopening Christianity." I chose this series several months ago, long before Governor DeWine announced that all health orders would be removed on June 2. So, I guess it was a little divine inspiration that this series began at almost the exact same time we were able to "reopen" everything in the church. I love it when the Holy Spirit moves like that. I've never doubted that the Spirit was present and moving, but affirmation like this now and then sure does feel nice!

For months now, I've been reading articles, surveys and expert commentaries on what the church will look like going forward, in a post-pandemic world. All of the literature is pretty consistent in predicting the church will be smaller after Covid than it was going into it. The general consensus among the experts seems to be somewhere around 2/3. In other words, the prediction is that attendance will, in general, be roughly 1/3 less than before Covid. The reasons for this expected decrease are many and varied, but the general consensus is clear that a decrease will be our reality going forward.

This can be a rather depressing prediction if we just focus on the short-term numbers, which I think is our natural human response. But what if we look at it from a different perspective? What if we look at it from a historic and Biblical perspective? I mean, this is not the first time something like this has happened. There have been many times that God's people have been reduced to what the Scriptures describe as a "remnant." And every time there was a "remnant" of faithful people, God did incredible and miraculous things to bring them back to vibrant health and strength. Why would we expect anything less this time?

Spending time preparing for this sermon series has really helped me stay focused on Jesus' promise to build his church, which really eliminates the fear of declining numbers. It also has been a powerful reminder that Jesus has given us The Great Commission, to "go" and "make" disciples. For the message on June 13, we will look at the question, "Is the church playing offense of defense?" Our Scripture for that day will be David and Goliath. David says to the Philistine giant, "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the Lord Almighty." While the Israelite soldiers were shaking in their armor, the young shepherd boy boldly steps forward to take on the giant. When I read this passage again, it hit me right between the eyes (pun intended). The Israelite army was playing defense, focused exclusively on not getting hurt or dying. But David was playing offense, relying on the strength of the Lord.

Jesus, in The Great Commission, calls us to play offense! Sadly, far too many churches have relegated themselves to playing defense for decades. The Church in America has actually been declining for years because it's become much more focused on defense than offense. Many churches today are only focused on not closing the doors during their lifetime. The things they do (and don't do) for fear of closing make it a self-fulfilling prophecy. I don't think that describes Grand Lake Church. I don't think we're playing defense. But I do think we could do a better job playing offense. I think we could be more intentional about The Great Commission. So in the weeks and months ahead, we will be implementing a strategy to equip the congregation with real tools that will help each of us be much better at living out The Great Commission (stay tuned). We're going to prove those "experts" wrong. We're going to be alive, vibrant and growing. We're going to be that remnant God uses to add to his numbers daily those who are being saved. I don't care what the "experts" say. These are exciting times to be the church!

Current Sermon Series **REOPENING CHRISTIANITY**

Join us for the five-week sermon series which started May 30, 2021.

Before a global pandemic had swept our nation and world, our collective witness of Jesus to others was at best a shadow of what it ought to have been. Sadly, the people we are trying to reach sometimes characterize us as the exact opposite of the One that we are pursuing. How could this be? Jesus is known for grace, good works, unity, and love. His followers have been known for judgment, hypocrisy, division, and hatred. We didn't miss the mark by a little bit. We completely misfired.

In this time where there is still great uncertainty in our world, I am certain the world needs a far greater expression of Jesus Christ.

2020 has been a year filled with debates on reopening strategies. This has been true for businesses, schools, universities, sports programs, and even churches.

Even though 2020 has produced many obstacles, it has also brought an incredible opportunity for us to examine thoroughly what it truly means to be Christian.

What if we could reopen Christianity? How would we reopen? What would we look like? What would we do? What if we could start by acknowledging that we have gone far away from who the God in the Bible has called us to be? What if we could use this time to refocus and come out a stronger representation of who Jesus is?

This study explores five questions every Christian must answer in this amazing opportunity to reopen Christianity!
