Pastor's Page

Boy, it sure does feel good to have at least some degree of normalcy this Fall. The choir is back, kids' choirs are back, and Wednesday meals are back. It almost feels like the pandemic is over, although the rising case counts and hospitalizations quickly remind us otherwise. But I don't want to talk about Covid in this letter. I want to talk about a different pandemic – the social media pandemic. Or, as I have recently started calling it, the social menace!

I realize that some of you who have grown to love scrolling (and ranting) on platforms like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat, etc. might find my terminology to be a bit over the top. But I don't think so. I truly believe that social media has turned into a social menace. I don't think it's a coincidence that our country is so divided right now. I don't think it's a coincidence that the level of clinically diagnosed anxiety among teens has doubled since smart phones became the norm for over 80% of the population. I don't think it's a coincidence that we're seeing so many mass shootings and hate crimes these days. I think all of these things (and more) are fueled by the venom and vitriol spewed out by many who sit behind the protection of their keyboards, many of whom claim to be Christians.

But are we really acting like Christians on social media? Are we really living out the gospel and making disciples on social media? Are we really slow to anger and quick to forgive on social media? Are we really acting Christ-like on social media? Some people are, certainly. But far too many are not! And those who are not are doing great harm to both the church and to society as a whole.

So let me just give you a few litmus test Scriptures to use as guides for your future social media usage. First, 1 Thessalonians 5:11 – *"Therefore encourage one another and build each other up."* Is that the true intent of your post, or are you really just trying to win an argument at all costs? Second, Philippians 4:8 – *"Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things."* How might your social media usage and interaction be different if you let this verse be your guide? The third is from Mark 14:61, when Jesus stood accused before the Sanhedrin – *"But Jesus remained silent and gave no answer."* Do you hear that? Jesus remained silent. Even though he was clearly in the right, he remained silent and gave no answer. You can do that too! You don't have to comment, argue or rant over everything you see and read on social media. You can simply ignore it and not pour fuel on the fire, making things even worse. Jesus also told Peter to put his sword away in Matthew 26:52, reminding him that *"if you live by the sword you will die by the sword."* And don't forget Matthew 5:38-39 – *"You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.' But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also."* Sometimes the best strategy is to simply not engage with someone who's trying to goad you into a fight.

I'm not saying Christians shouldn't stand up and speak up for what we believe in. Of course we should. In fact, if we'd done a better job of that in the past, we might not be in the mess we're in today. But social media rants are not the way to do it. I mean, c'mon, when was the last time anyone's mind was changed because of someone's social media rant? Don't fall into the trap of thinking you're an activist, when really you're just an antagonist. Instead, focus on the Scriptures above before you log onto social media the next time and see if that doesn't change how you post (or if you even post at all). And, if you truly want to be an activist (and I encourage you to do so), start doing things that truly make a difference, like attending City Council meetings, School Board meetings, write your Congressperson, or organize a demonstration. But do it peacefully, respectfully and lovingly. Remember, you are an ambassador of Christ. So make sure all that you say and do appropriately reflects Jesus and points others to him.





The focus in a community group is to talk about God's Word together in a way that helps us to be more obedient so that we will be "doers" of the Word and not "hearers" only. (James 1:22)

U – United in Love:

The goal is to not only grow closer to God but also to each other in order to reach COMMUNITY – authentically being a part of each other's lives – throughout the week and not just during the meetings. A healthy community group is bound by a "Community Group Covenant."

P – Pray for one another:

Time will always be set aside where we can genuinely share what's going on in our lives and authentically pray for one another.
