Has anyone noticed that even though the mask mandate has been lifted and society has opened back up considerably, things are still not back to "normal"? The service industry is still woefully understaffed in many instances, making it difficult for places like restaurants to truly get back to "normal." In fact, it's so bad that many places actually have signs posted asking customers to be nice to the workers because they are doing the best they can while short-staffed. How sad is it that our society has regressed to the point that we have to be specifically asked to not be mean to people?

Suffice it to say, things are not back to "normal" and, quite frankly, may never be again. I've been listening to a lot of podcasts and doing some webinar trainings specific to the church. Jorge Acevedo, pastor of a United Methodist mulita-site megachurch in Florida, used a sports analogy, saying, "It's like before the pandemic we were playing football or baseball, but today I don't even know what sport we're playing." As a result, the latest buzzword is "new normal." In other words, some things will go back to the way they were, but some things never will. There's good and bad in this, as some things weren't that good to begin with and needed to be changed. But, we all know that human nature is not typically a big fan of change, even when it's good.

As much as I like to think of myself as someone who is flexible and able to "just roll with it," I'm finding myself strangely longing for some sense of the familiar. I need a little bit of the old "tried and true" in this season of "new normal" development. So I'm ecstatic that Fall programming is starting back up this month. I hope and pray that things like Wednesday Night Meals, Community Groups and the Choir give us enough of the familiar to help get us all back on track. One thing I'm most excited about is our Old Fashioned Church Picnic scheduled for October 3rd. Everyone is invited to bring a covered dish and the church will provide the meat, including a hog roast! We'll play some games, both old and new, and enjoy a time of fellowship. I can't wait! I honestly don't think I've ever been this excited for a picnic!

So, if you've found yourself longing for something familiar, you are not alone. The Fall programming and church picnic should be just what the doctor (a.k.a.the Great Physician) ordered. But let's not discount the value of the "new normal" God is bringing forth. I'm reminded of Isaiah 43:19 in which God says, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." As uncomfortable as change can be, I'm choosing to embrace it and anticipate the new thing God is already doing. I can't see it with any real clarity yet, but I can perceive it. And I know it will be good. I choose to believe that God is making a way in the wildernesses and wastelands of this hurting and broken world. I pray that you will join me in embracing this new thing God is doing, even as we hold on to some of the truly good things of the past.

U – United in Love:

The goal is to not only grow closer to God but also to each other in order to reach COMMUNITY – authentically being a part of each other's lives – throughout the week and not just during the meetings. A healthy community group is bound by a "Community Group Covenant."

P – Pray for one another:

Time will always be set aside where we can genuinely share what's going on in our lives and authentically pray for one another.


Halloween Party
