HEAR IT: Listen to the Text and Discover the Truth

Introduction:

Paul's extended stay in Ephesus at the beginning of his third missionary journey provided for him both *opportunity* and *opposition*. That is not only clear from reading the narrative of Acts 19, but also from Paul's own description of his experience in Ephesus from our theme verse above. As we revisit this narrative, may the Lord encourage us to persevere in spite of the pressures or the problems that may arise as we proclaim the gospel in our community.
