FROM THE PASTOR

I would like Christmas 2021 at Kernstown United Methodist Church to be a time when the congregation makes a special effort to invite people back to church. I believe the message of new hope and anticipation of a gracious future is needed in our nation as we emerge out of the COVID pandemic. The messengers who deliver this message are often referred to as "angels." Although the Christmas narrative in Matthew and Luke feature **Angels** as primary players, angels are mentioned throughout the Old and New Testament from Genesis to Revelation. This Advent and Christmas, the theme for our worship will be **"Angels Among Us."** The sermons will explore the divine/human relationship and how Christ establishes a new creation where angels and principalities are subject to His redeeming power. Scripture tells us that our place in the Divine Cosmos is **"...a little lower than the angels"** (Psalm 8:5, Hebrews 2:7, & Luke 20:34-36), however, there are many secular conceptions about angels that do not reflect a biblical or theological understanding of these mysterious creatures. As we explore our relationship with divine beings, we will also enjoy the mystery of how we live out "... the better angels of our nature."

When you come to church during the Advent and Christmas season, you will be invited to try on a pair of angel wings and maybe a halo. The joy and expectation of this wonderful season can be enhanced as we have fun with the angels (they certainly have fun with us). Please come and invite your friends and neighbors and co-workers to worship with us in this most joyful and expectant season.

Blood Pressure Checks will resume when safe after COVID.

COVID Update: Booster doses of COVID 19 vaccines have been approved by the FDA. If you have been fully vaccinated, check with your doctor to determine if you should receive a booster dose. If you are not fully vaccinated with COVID vaccine, CDC recommends that you receive it. COVID vaccines are available at some pharmacies and physician offices. Continue to follow COVID guidelines to prevent spread of the disease:

- * wash hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or hand disinfecting gel.
- * If you are fully vaccinated, a mask is not required, but you may wear a mask if you feel more comfortable
- * Maintain social distancing of 3-6 feet
- * If you have a fever, feel sick, or have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID, do NOT attend church and contact your physician.

FLU Season: It's time to get your flu shot if you haven't. Guidelines are similar to those for COVID 19 to help slow the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses like flu (nose, throat, and lungs):

- * Get the Flu Shot
- * Avoid close contact
- * Avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth
- * Stay away from people who are sick

- * Stay home when sick
 - * Cover mouth and nose – when coughing or sneezing – use tissue and throw away immediately
 - * **Wash hands** frequently with soap and water or use antibacterial gel
 - * Practice good health habits

5. Show love freely.
6. Know that sometimes it's ok to let things go.
7. Take time for exercise/hobbies/creativity.
8. Understand that everyone is scared sometimes.

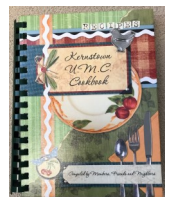

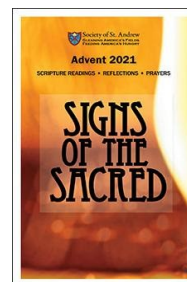
