

### 1. The Early Church (Ray Vander Laan)

Teacher/Leader: Ric Dunkle

From the very beginning and throughout history God has revealed himself through human servants. Nations and cultures have come and gone over the millennia, but the message of the scriptures is eternal and remains unchanged. Throughout the course of history God has chosen to reveal himself within the cultures and conditions that existed; therefore, it is important to understand how these various cultures were used by God to communicate His Word. ### CONTINUE THE CDC GUIDELINES FOR COVID 19:



**SEASONAL FLU SEASON IS APPROACHING:** With COVID19 pandemic, it is more important than other years to receive the Flu Vaccine.

**Preventing Flu** – to help slow the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses like flu (nose, throat, and lungs)

- Get Flu Vaccine (A Flu Shot)
- Avoid close contact
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth
- Stay away from people who are sick
- Stay home when sick
- Cover mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing use tissue and throw away immediately
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water or use hand sanitizer gel
- Practice good health habits



## **Health Ministry (Cont.)**

### Signs and Symptoms of Flu:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills (but not everyone will have a fever)
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatigue (very tired)
- Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.

## **Operation Christmas Update from Lisa Dawson**



I am the KUMC project leader for OCC, otherwise known as the shoe-box ministry. This is a new position for me as I am learning from my predecessor, Bob Greatorex. Boy, do I have some big shoes to fill! Under Bob's leadership, Kernstown has a great record of supporting this ministry with over 100 boxes donated

each year (last year's total was 150). In addition, Bob and KUMC members have volunteered many hours during the collection weeks to pack 1000s of boxes that were dropped off as KUMC was the designated collection site for the area. Thank You, Bob, for your leadership, time (countless hours), muscle and patience. Thank you, KUMC, for your continued dedication to this ministry.

In the past, KUMC members have participated in the OCC project in 2 ways:

The first way was a yearlong OCC corporate collection effort. Each month focused on a specific type of item (games, school supplies, clothing, etc). Members would deposit their donation for the month in a designated OCC box at KUMC. A packing party would be held in early November to assemble the boxes from the collection of items. Currently, there is a collection box, but it does not have a lot of items due to Covid. The good news is that we do have some leftover items from previous years. I have counted all that we have on hand and I will be posting the list in an accessible area at church. I will also post items needed and you can sign up to donate items and/or donate money to cover the \$9 shipping cost per box. I realize there are only about 10 weeks until the packing party; I have faith that God will provide!

The second way to participate is to purchase items, pack your own box and pay the \$9 shipping cost per box. Specific details of what **can and can't** be packed are on the KUMC website. Bring your packed shoeboxes to KUMC by November 14<sup>th</sup>.
