Health Education: Cancer Prevention Eating well and moving more can improve your health, help you feel better, and protect you against cancer.

- 1. Move More. Adults Get at least 150 minutes of moderate or 75 minutes of vigorous activity per week
- 2. Sit Less. Avoid long periods of sitting or lying down especially while watching TV, using your cell phone, playing computer or video games.
- 3. Follow a healthy eating pattern with a focus on plant sources.
- *Foods high in vitamins, minerals, and other nutrients
- *Foods that are not high in calories
- *A colorful variety of vegetables dark green, red, and orange
- * Fiber-rich beans and peas
- * A colorful variety of fruits
- * Whole grains (in bread, pasta, etc) and brown rice

A healthy eating pattern means limiting or not including:

- *Red meats like beef, pork, and lamb
- *Processed meats like bacon, sausage, luncheon meats, and hot dogs
- *Sugary drinks, including soft drinks, sports drinks, and fruit drinks
- *Highly processed foods and refined grain products

Tips for a healthy eating pattern

- *Fill most of your plate with colorful vegetables, fruits, beans, and whole grains
- *Choose fish, poultry, or beans as your main sources of protein instead of red meat or processed meats

From your Lay Leader

I will always remember what happened to me on April 1, 1973. During the evening worship service, I knelt at an old wooden bench in the sanctuary of Rosedale Christian Church. I remember praying, "God, I haven't lived long enough to do anything really bad? I've been reading the Bible. I read that everyone is born a sinner. I don't want to be one anymore. I asked Jesus to come live in my heart. I always had a nagging thought. When would I be a mature Christian. I attended Sunday School faithfully. I prayed haphazardly. If I prayed more, is that how I'd "get there?" I recall a conversation I had with Kitty Skiles. She was a longtime member of my former church. She took me and my kids under her wing and mentored me in many ways. I asked her when she became a wise and mature Christian. Kitty was in her 70s then. She laughed almost until she cried. Kitty had been a Christian most of her life. She was active in the UMW, went to Annual Conference, cooked in the church kitchen, and prayed for lots of people. Still she hadn't become a mature Christian. I went deeper into thought as my question didn't appear to have an answer. That conversation took place about 30 years ago. I've taught classes, facilitated small groups, served on district committees, been a lay speaker and lay leader, taken Disciple classes, and so on. I've learned that is what John Wesley meant by saying "we Methodists are moving onto perfection." We mature when we see Jesus face to face. Until then, I will "keep on, keeping on." 


