

## Letter from the Pastor

Jackson & Donna Crum Coming July 3 & 4

Dear Church of the Saviour family,

The Sunday that COVID initially closed Church of the Saviour down, former pastor Jackson Crum was set to preach during our Missions March (March 15, 2020). There was concern at the time that sticking with the Missions theme might mute out an important global outreach message because of the loud noise that accompanied COVID. 

### **COS Sports League!**



# **Missions Update**

### **Global Outreach Strategy**

To summon the nations, through holistic discipleship, to worship the One true God with us. That statement captures my heart. It reminds me of who God is, the purpose of life and the countless lives that are in unreached people groups that have yet to hear the Good News of Jesus. I'm excited that we have developed this as the mission statement for Global Outreach at COS.

We are building momentum as we share more outcomes from the strategic review process of where God is leading us as a church. Last fall, during a 6-week sermon series, we shared the above mission statement, the five values of missions (God-centered, prayer-dependent, joyfully-surrendered, intentionally-focused and fully-engaged), and the Scriptures that guide them. ### **Reach International Yard Sale Update**

Moving to a different country is not easy, even if it's for a happy reason like being with family, an education or a new job. It can take years to connect and make friends, learn the language, the culture and how and where to get things done. As followers of Jesus, we want to welcome those that are in this transition and support them as they navigate learning all these things while sharing the love of Jesus. ReachInternational is the COS ministry to the diaspora community in our area. There are many ways that we as a church do this especially through our English as a Second Language program, and our annual yard sale for international students.



Last fall we didn't hold the yard sale and very few, if any new international students enrolled in universities for the semester. During the winter/spring semester some students came and we were able to meet their needs by matching them with families with furniture to donate. Little did we know at the time that meeting this need on a smaller scale would provide a great opportunity to build relationships. One of our ReachInternational volunteers connected with an international student, took them to view the furniture and organized the delivery. This offered the opportunity for the volunteer to develop a friendship with the student and to spend more time together over coffee, ice cream and other activities. We met the student's physical needs as well as made connections during a time when it was really hard to meet people.

This fall there are still a lot of unknowns for new international students. We want to be able to meet their needs as they arise. However, we won't be holding a yard sale. Instead, we will follow the model we have been using this year to match furniture with student

needs. We will need more volunteers to make this happen as well as donations and people for delivery. We already know of 3 students that have current needs for furniture. In addition, we'll be partnering with current and former students to plan social activities and professional development workshops for international students. We need volunteers to plan out all of the details to make these events occur.
