Small-Group Discussion Questions

You can use these discussion questions to facilitate small groups after your sermon, or even create handouts for students to work through the message as you go. These questions are designed to help students think critically about the sermon and what it means to them.

- 1. What was something from the message that stood out to you and why?
- 2. What are some of your favorite Bible stories and why? (Small group leaders & Parents be ready to share this bit).
- 3. Do you pray before reading your Bible? Or during? What does that look like for you?
- 4. What is your plan or process for reading the Bible? What is one tip you could share that helps you read God's Word consistently?
- 5. Does reading your Bible affect you differently at different times? Like when you've been to camp, or when you're super tired?
- 6. What approach works best for you in reading the Bible: taking 15-30 minutes at a time each day or finding short moments throughout the day and why? How can each be helpful?
- 7. How does reading the Bible help you grow in your faith?
- 8. What is the biggest struggle for you when it comes to reading your Bible? How can you do better with that?
- 9. Why did God give us the Bible? What role does the Bible play in our lives?
- 10. What time are you going to set up to read your Bible? Where are you going to start? How can we help you be accountable?
- 11. What are some questions you have about the Bible?
