Sunday, April 3 – Holy Thursday (Mark 14:12-31) – we will join in the Lord's Last Supper


Sunday, April 10 – Good Friday (Mark 14:32-15:39) – a solemn service of remembrance

THE WEEK THAT CHANGED THE WORLD

A PASTORAL LETTER FROM ANDY

Dear church family,

I love being your pastor. I love our mission. I love sharing the gospel and teaching the Scriptures. I love helping to create an environment where new people feel welcome and all people have opportunities to grow to maturity in Christ, use their gifts to serve, and respond to the call to share the good news of Jesus with others through witness and missions. This is my calling, and I am so glad to be answering my calling here in this church.

You know what I don't love? Denominational politics and posturing, and there has been a lot of that going on lately as the United Methodist Church continues to try to find a way forward despite the significant theological differences causing strife. The average person in the pew doesn't necessarily feel the pain of it, but our church leadership does. They have invested countless hours, precious energy, and faithful effort to ensure our church positions itself best to carry out the mission and ministry of Jesus in our region as our denomination implodes. I cannot wait until the day when we can reinvest that time into more hands-on ministry. But for now, we continue doing the things we do not love in order to protect and provide for that which we do love – our church.

Let me update you on the latest. The Commission on General Conference voted (14-9) to postpone our upcoming General Conference until our next scheduled General Conference in May of 2024. The stated rationale was an inability for international delegates to get visas in time for the August/September 2022 dates. Dissenting voices on the Commission argued that international delegates couldn't get visa appointments until letters of invitation were issued by the Commission – something they hadn't yet done even though they've known the upcoming dates for a year now. Furthermore, all African members of the commission (those most affected by delayed visa appointments) voted against the postponement. The mistrust and dysfunction run deep, and this further delay silences the voices of the delegates elected to legislate a way for the United Methodist Church to separate amicably.

In response to the Commission's decision, the Global Methodist Church announced that it will officially launch on May 1, 2022. The continuing United Methodist Church has shared its vision to liberalize the sexual ethic and affirm theological pluralism (ordaining clergy with various beliefs on core doctrine). The Global Methodist Church will retain the present

UMC doctrine and has stated its commitment to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, the inspiration and authority of the Scriptures, and the work of the Holy Spirit in conveying God's truth and grace to all people.

Our transition team, created to navigate all the transitions within the UMC, continues to meet and explore all options available to our church (including the two options noted above, the Free Methodist Church, the Wesleyan Church, or becoming independent). Our team believes the vast majority of our leadership and congregation support our current doctrine and practice. We have not yet determined the best course of action to preserve that witness of our church for generations to come. The team is still exploring and keeping open all options until enough information is collected. Once that is complete, the transition team will make recommendations to our church council. When the council is ready to act, the decisions will come before our membership for a vote. At this point there is no firm timeline.

I understand that for most of you, this doesn't matter at all. You just want our church to continue our meaningful ministry that makes a difference in your life and the world around us! For others, this denominational turmoil creates great anxiety in you. Let's do all we can to encourage one another. To that end, here are a few things our transition team hopes you'll join us in:

- Pray and Fast Please pray for our church and our team! Join us in fasting at least one meal every Wednesday in order to focus on prayer for discernment about our future.
- Avoid Conjecture and Gossip We seek to be transparent about our process. If you have thoughts, please express them as your own and don't speak for the church's leadership. If you hear rumors, please don't spread them, and encourage each other to ask questions directly to our church leadership: Tracy Kennett (church council chair), Mickey Jackson (lay leader), Andy Adams (senior pastor)
- 3. Focus on our Mission Keep inviting people on a journey with Jesus! Keep connecting, growing, serving, sharing, and worshiping! Keep loving God and loving others! Let's journey to the cross together with faith, hope, and love and a commitment to follow Jesus wherever he leads.

Troy United Methodist Church Staff Resignation Announcement

We are sad to announce that our long-time traditional music Accompanist, Mike Rogier, is resigning as of March 31. Mike has also been serving as Interim Director of Traditional Music since October 2021. The interim role ended when our new Director of Traditional Music, Rebecca Koebbe, began serving on March 1.

- On behalf of the Church Congregation, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee expresses sincere gratitude to Mike for his 4-1/2 years of service as Accompanist.
- We are especially grateful for the "double duty" that Mike has been doing the past four months as both Accompanist and Interim Director.
- Mike did this even though several health challenges, preparing for retirement, and as the workload at his full-time job, as Physics Instructor at Belleville West, increased when the department head unexpectedly passed away.

The Rogier family has been multi-generational supporters of the Troy UMC music ministry starting with his parents, Bob and Diana. Mike and his wife Dynette, along with his children, Joel and Lydia, have continued the Rogier family tradition of musical excellence while being dedicated to the mission of Troy UMC. Mike's sister, Jennifer King, has also been part of the music ministry over the years. We hope that Mike will continue to be involved in Troy UMC music, but in a less demanding and more flexible role.

Mike has indicated that he feels good about the music program being in the hands of Rebecca:

"I am so thankful that Rebecca has joined us. She is delightful, and I am confident that she is an answer to our prayers and that we are an answer to hers. She is more than qualified musically, and I believe she brings a desire to love and serve people and God. I am certain you can look forward to some excellent worship music in the traditional worship services moving into the future."

We wish Mike and his family the best. We will formally recognize Mike's work in the near future but have not scheduled anything due to his busy schedule.

We will be recruiting an Accompanist soon.
