

# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

### You're Invited to Become a Disciple-Maker

One of many November highlights was our Discipleship Luncheon when I shared a vision for disciple-making with the over 75 people interested in taking a next step toward fulfilling Jesus' Great Commission (see Matthew 28:19-20). Here is the nutshell version for all of you who couldn't make it!

**Definition of a Disciple:** There are three integral parts of discipleship as articulated in Jesus' call of Peter and Andrew in Matthew 4:19: "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of people."

Come, follow me - A disciple is someone who makes a conscious choice to follow Jesus.

*I will make you* – A disciple is one who is being remade into the image of Jesus, transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit to embody Christlike behavior and character.

Fishers of people – A disciple participates in Jesus' mission to make other disciples who make disciples.

**Reflections on Troy UMC:** During my monastic retreat in September, I spent much time praying and reflecting on this question: "Does our church make disciples who make disciples?"

Come, follow me – I believe most of our church family have responded to Jesus' invitation and surrendered their lives to him and seek to follow him.

I will make you – I observe much of our church family engaging in community (journey groups and bands) with a desire to be transformed to become more like Jesus. The fruit is exhibited through the 8 core practices of a disciple: 1) Community, 2) Prayer, 3) Scripture, 4) Service, 5) Witness, 6) Stewardship, 7) Worship, and 8) Sabbath.

Fishers of people – A vast number of our church family <u>indirectly</u> participates in disciple making through service and giving, but only a small few <u>directly</u> participate in disciple making. I don't see this as a lack of faithfulness by our members as much as an indictment on my leadership and strategy for equipping our church family to become disciple makers. God has been working on my heart!

**The Vision:** To become a church that intentionally makes disciples who make disciples.

The Strategy: Here's what is necessary to make this vision a reality:

People who are bought in - I'm hoping that's YOU! See the invitation below.


Context for disciple making – John Wesley discovered that the best context for life-transformative discipleship occurs within the context of a band of 3-4 same-gendered people who meet weekly for the purpose of intentionally growing as a disciple through confession, prayer, and encouragement. <u>Bands</u> will be our context for disciple-making.

A reproduceable process – We need a tool for disciple making! After some research, we have decided to utilize a curriculum called *Discipleship Essentials* by Greg Ogden. It is designed to be worked through as a band over the course of 12-18 months. Group members covenant from the onset to each take on 2-3 others to lead through this same discipleship material upon completion of it themselves. Disciples making disciples!

**The Invitation:** Would YOU be interested in joining one of these disciple-making discipleship bands? We could help you get connected to a group. Maybe you're already in a band and your entire group would like to participate! Or maybe God is tugging on your heart to prayerfully invite 2-3 others to begin this journey with you. We are hoping to have an initial wave of participants begin this discipleship adventure between now and mid-February.

### **Traditional Music Update**

Dear Church Family,

Thank you for giving Emily a big "Thank You" on October 31 for her service as the Director of Traditional Worship Arts. She is not gone but has resigned from the half-time role in order to focus on her full-time responsibilities at Edwardsville High School and on her family.

The Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) is moving to fill the the Director of Traditional Worship Arts position on a permanent half-time basis. This search may take some time due to the unique combination of Musical, Directing, Organizational, and Interpersonal skills needed to thrive in the role. We are conducting a formal search and recruitment process.

In the interim, our talented Accompanist, Mike Rogier, is providing leadership to the chancel and bell choirs. This is a challenge he has agreed to take on for a while to support the church. We are very grateful to Mike for stepping up to this dual role at the church in addition to his full-time job teaching physics in a local high school.

During this interim, we are asking the TUMC congregation to do a few things to help the traditional services:

**PRAYER:** Pray for our Director search and for Mike as he leads the Traditional Music Team during this interim.

**JOIN THE TEAM:** Step up and join the Traditional Music team via the chancel choir, the bells, or with special music.

**SUPPORT:** Show patience and understanding during this transition. Please offer encouragement to Mike and the musicians during this time. Like many organizations, the church is recovering from pandemic woes, so we are in a bit of a start-up mode.

### **Alzheimer's and Dementia Help and Training**

Taking care of a person living with Alzheimer's or related dementia at home consists of specialized hard work. To do this work successfully, caregivers need special skills, knowledge, and a positive attitude that helps them to care for themselves. St. John's Community Care offers Savvy Caregiver training sessions several times a year to aid family caregivers in this role.

The Savvy Caregiver Program is a free, six-session training for family and friends who are actively caring for those living with Alzheimer's or related dementia. St. John's trainers use curriculum developed by the University of Minnesota for interactive classes.

In each session, participants learn relevant techniques and coping skills to manage daily living situations. The sessions are designed to teach basic knowledge, skills, and attitudes needed to handle the challenges of caring for someone with dementia. With this new knowledge and understanding, family caregivers are able to reduce stress and increase their sense of competence in dementia caregiving.

The Savvy Caregiver Program will help you:


- Understand the impact of dementia on both you and the person in your care.
- Learn the skills you need to manage daily life
- Take control and set goals
- Communicate more effectively
- Strengthen family resources
- Feel better about your caregiving
- Take care of you!
