A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Jesus is Greater

I hope you've been learning, growing, and enjoying our journey through the book of Hebrews. It's been my continual prayer that our deep study of this often-overlooked portion of Scripture would inspire you to fall more in love with the Word of God, both the written Word and the Word made flesh: Jesus. I hope that Jesus becomes greater in your eyes. In fact, that is one of the organizing themes of Hebrews. *Jesus is greater!*

Jesus is greater than the angels (chapter 1)

Jesus is greater than Moses (chapter 3)

Jesus brings a greater rest than Joshua did (chapter 4)

Jesus is a greater high priest (chapters 5-7)

Jesus brings the new covenant, which is greater than the old (chapter 8)

Jesus' ministry is greater than the priests because it's in the heavenly realm (chapters 8-9)

Jesus' sacrifice is greater (chapters 9-10)

The details of Jesus' superiority are as significant for us today as they were for the original hearers. Those first hearing this sermon were being tempted to abandon their faith under increasing persecution. They were considering a return to their former religious practices. You may not consciously choose to align with a different religion, but that doesn't mean that you aren't facing the daily, practical temptations to appease the god of consumerism, bow to the idol of nationalism, succumb to moralism or performance-based salvation, or give your endorsement to the non-Christian worldview that places feelings and desires as an ultimate authority.

You and I need to be reminded that following Jesus and His ways brings greater peace and joy than any of the alternatives, that life in the community of Jesus, the church, is greater than rugged individualism and that the mission of Jesus — to seek and save the lost to the glory of God — brings greater meaning and purpose than anything else this world offers. I pray we each come to the point of letting go of the lesser things we're tempted to cling to in order that we would receive the greater promises Jesus offers.

Encouraging Words from God's Word

During this global pandemic, having faith in the darkest valley has been difficult. It's natural to feel fearful, even though we're about to turn the corner on this pandemic. But as believers, we can have a bold faith and hope during any crisis because of who our God is.

- He is never changing, even when our world is (Malachi 3:6)
- He is all-powerful, strong, and able to do anything He wills (Psalm 147:5, Romans 1:20)
- He is all-knowing, having knowledge of everything past, present, and future (Isaiah 46:9–10)
- He is faithful and always will be (2 Timothy 2:13)



And God is so much more. God is beyond what we can conceive in our limited human minds. God's purposes and promises are sure, even when we don't understand them, even when we aren't sure where He is or what He's doing.

Charles Spurgeon said, "God is too good to be unkind and He is too wise to be mistaken. And when we cannot trace His hand, we must trust His heart."

Again, trusting God and having faith following a pandemic is a bold stance. But do you know what else is bold? Coming before the Almighty God of the universe in prayer. Hebrews 4:16 instructs us, "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace in the time of need."

Come boldly to the God who is unchanging, always faithful, and never caught by surprise. Keep your faith in God and let the knowledge of who God is calm your fears.

From the Amplified version of the Bible, "Casting all your cares [all your anxieties, all your worries, and all your concerns, once and for all] on Him, for He cares about you [with deepest affection, and watches over you very carefully]."


Learn Your ABCs this Summer!

July 11 – August 30 (8 weeks) Mondays, 7-8:15 p.m. via Zoom

The Absolute Basics of the Christian Faith is a visual introduction to the core beliefs of the Christian faith. While it assumes no background knowledge of the Scriptures or church teachings, this 8-unit study is stocked with rich explanation and engaging videos that will solidify the foundation of your faith.

This study is designed for people of all ages and would be perfect to do as a family with children 5th grade and above! 

Ancient Hebrew Tabernacle Exhibit


Tour the Old Testament Tabernacle at Troy UMC! July 17-25 — Daily tours from 1-7 p.m. (75 min. each)
