It's been encouraging to see so many of you returning to Sunday morning worship in person! Thankfully, our State is now in the "bridge phase" between phase 4 and 5, which expands our opportunities!

What does the "bridge phase" mean for our church?

- Our capacity limits have increased from 25% to 60%, which means we will have enough seating to host the usual number of folks we had pre-COVID.
- Registration is no longer required for any of our four services.
- Journey Groups and discipleship bands are starting to meet in person, whether in group members' homes or at our church building. However, there are only a few rooms at church that can safely hold larger groups; contact our office to see if there's availability for your group to meet.

Now is the perfect time to reengage in the life of the church!

COVID-19 UPDATE

With newly revised guidelines from the CDC, IDPH, and Conference Leadership regarding masks for vaccinated people, the Troy United Methodist Church Council approves the following updates to our COVID guidelines:

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

- Fully vaccinated people are no longer required to wear a mask or social distance inside or outside for church activities, but may if so inclined.
- Non-vaccinated people of all ages (children above two, teenagers, adults) and for all reasons (unavailability, personal preference, health reasons, etc.) are still required to wear masks for all indoor church activities, but may unmask for outdoor worship with 10 feet of social distancing.
- With these new guidelines, Troy UMC will have red/yellow/green wristbands available at worship services (beginning 5/23) for you to wear to indicate your personal comfort with the new guidelines. Please love and respect one another during this time of slow transition "back to normal."
- Troy United Methodist Church will not ask anyone to reveal his/her vaccination status to participate in church activities. All people are welcome to participate in worship and other ministries.



Thank you for following these guidelines for everyone's church benefit and safety!

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Take Action

I hope God has been working in your heart as we journey through Hebrews together! Thus far, we have been encouraged to hold fast because Jesus is divine — He has spoken His Word of salvation to us. We can hold fast because Jesus became human, like us in our humanity but perfectly obedient to God. He died the death we deserve and through Him we can be raised to glory. We can hold fast despite our failures, and we can hold fast even in the face of death!

But we must be careful not to miss this message of salvation. We don't want to drift like the Israelites did. The Israelites, after being saved from slavery in Egypt, did not have faith as expressed in obedience, and they missed the rest that God offered them. When we respond to God's Word of salvation with faith, we not only experience a supernatural rest here and now (see Matthew 11:28), but we know that we will inherit the eternal rest that God has promised.

Responding to God's Word of salvation by faith compels us to *Take Action*. I can't wait for us to discover the best kinds of action to take this June as we journey through the end of Hebrews chapter 6. God's Word is alive and active and powerful (Hebrews 4:12-13)! Let's be transformed together! I hope you'll study along with us following the reading plan below:

Conclusion of "Hold Fast"

May 23 - Don't Drift - Study Hebrews 3:1-19 and explore Psalm 95:7-11

May 30 - The Promise - Study Hebrews 4:1-13 and explore Psalm 95:11 and Genesis 2:2

"Take Action"

June 6 - Draw Near - Study Hebrews 4:14-16 and look for similarities in Hebrews 10:19-25

June 13 - Submit - Study Hebrews 5:1-10 and familiarize yourself with Psalm 110:1-4

June 20 (Father's Day) - Mature - Study Hebrews 5:11-6:3

June 27 - Anchor - Study Hebrews 6:4-20

Caring for One Another

The Christian life is meant to be one of care and compassion. The phrase "one another" is derived from the Greek word "allelon," which means "one another, each other; mutually, reciprocally." It occurs 100 times in the New Testament. Approximately 59 of those occurrences are specific commands teaching us how (and how *not*) to relate to one another. Obedience to those commands is imperative. It forms the basis for all true Christian community, and has a direct impact on our witness to the world (John 13:35).

For example, we're to **Love** one another (John 13:34 — This command occurs at least 16 times); **Care** for one another (1 Corinthians 12:25); **Serve** one another (Galatians 5:13); **Bear with** one another (Colossians 3:13); and **Comfort** one another (1 Thessalonians 4:18).

Caring ministries vary when it comes to individual churches and how they function. There are innumerable ways Troy UMC offers to help our members who are hurting or lost. In their time of need, we need to be the "hands and feet" of God by actively serving with purpose.

Here are a few ideas to help us all become God's hands and feet:

Care for church family members facing a serious illness.

- 1. Send cards and encouragement often.
- 2. Plan and arrange to clean their house or do yardwork.
- 3. Make a hospital or home visit to brighten a person's day (once COVID restrictions are lifted).
- 4. Create a basket of small individually-wrapped gifts so the recipient will have a basket of cheer they can go to whenever they need a lift.

Care through prayer.

- 1. Stop and pray for those on the church's email prayer list.
- 2. Communicate with the office your specific prayer needs regularly so our prayer team can pray for your need(s).

Care for those in recovery.

- 1. Be a part of our Care Team's Meal Ministry.
- 2. Have a Zoom or FaceTime call while they recover.
- 3. Help a member by driving them to a doctor visit or treatment.
- 4. Take communion elements to the recovering patient.

Care for those who are grieving.

- 1. Send cards to families who are grieving.
- 2. Make phones calls a couple of weeks after things have settled down and they're now alone.


Learn Your ABCs this Summer!

July 11 – August 30 (8 weeks) Mondays, 7-8:15 p.m. via Zoom

The Absolute Basics of the Christian Faith is a visual introduction to the core beliefs of the Christian faith. While it assumes no background knowledge of the Scriptures or church teachings, this 8-unit study is stocked with rich explanation and engaging videos that will solidify the foundation of your faith.

This study is designed for people of all ages and would be perfect to do as a family with children 5th grade and above! Each week will consist of two short (and very fun) videos with discussion around questions like *Who is God?*, *Why is there evil?*, *Who is Jesus?*, *What is salvation?*, *Who is the Holy Spirit?*, *What is the church?*, *What is our future?*, and more! There will also be roughly 10 easy pages to read each week.

Led by Pastor Andy and Minister of Discipleship, Bonnie Abel, this journey group is a great opportunity to root your faith in the essentials. Harvest of Hope Initiative

This past December YOU came together and generously gave over \$126,000 to support the ministry of our church. Because of your generosity we were able to send a check for \$23,000 to Global Hope Network's "Harvest of Hope" Initiative that provides immediate relief and training for food sustainability to several rural villages in Southeast Asia. We are excited to report to you now, a few ways in which God has moved and utilized the funds so far!

Upon receiving the money, the communities of Lombang, Salutahongan, and Salutambung in West Sulawesi, Indonesia were immediately assisted in response to the earthquake that hit days earlier. Our financial support was a God send to these people, some of which, who had lost everything.

There are also plans to utilize the remainder of the money to provide relief and development in Myanmar. Since we sent the funds, the economic situation in Myanmar has spiraled due to a military takeover of the government and widespread protests. Due to this disruption, GHNI was only recently able to send funds for relief, which will be distributed among the villages of Myat Hlae, Htoong Buu, Yone Taw, Paletwa and others. In addition to this relief, GHNI will be providing training and consultation on simple, sustainable food production techniques for households in these communities.

Thank you for continuing to be the hands and feet of God and supporting God's mission and ministry both here in Troy, in our surrounding area, and around the world!

Troy & St. Jacob Summer Lunch Program

This summer, we will again be doing a summer lunch program in both the Troy and St. Jacob communities for the children in our towns. Our church family will be volunteering on Mondays in Troy; St. Jacob volunteer days are not yet set.

In the past, Troy UMC was responsible for the entirety of the St. Jacob lunch program, but this year we are working to connect with the other St. Jacob churches to make the lunch program something that anyone and everyone can be a part of. We are better together!
