

New Series in June!

In June we will continue our 20-week, guided tour of the Bible's essential passages! After laying the foundations of God's original intent for humanity in creation and the mission he gave to Abraham and his descendants, we're ready to explore some new sights in the Old Testament. Throughout the story of Israel's history and God's plan of redemption through them, nothing was ever exactly as it should be. Despite God's ongoing faithfulness, his people never completely lived out the mission intended for them. But throughout the struggles, their story repeatedly pointed to a hope filled future. These centuries of the Old Testament are best characterized by God's people *Anticipating* the fulfillment of the great promises that God was working to bring about. This month we will visit destinations that highlight a few of those key things God's people were *Anticipating*!



A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

How do you discern God's will?

This is a common question I receive in my pastoral role. How do I know what God wants me to do? When responding to this question we must first make it clear that God has revealed his **universal will** for all people through the Scriptures. God's universal will is that all people will be adopted into his family by the grace made available through faith in Jesus atoning work on the cross and then empowered by his Spirit, join his mission as his representatives to make disciples of Jesus Christ throughout the nations. But within that framework, how can we discern God's **particular will** for your life or mine? Here is a helpful approach that should be followed in order!



Scripture: When wondering if God wants you to do something or not, begin with God's revelation. What is the witness of Scripture? To know God's will, you must know God's Word. If the Bible has a clear prohibition or affirmation, then you know your answer! If there appears to be grey area, reflect on the applicable biblical principles at play and move on to...

Prayer (and other spiritual disciplines): God's Spirit dwells in his redeemed people, and God's Spirit longs to reveal God's presence and power and direction. Practicing the spiritual disciplines puts us in best position to hear the Spirit's leading. But it's best to confirm that leading through...

Godly Counsel: God's Spirit not only dwells in us, but our brothers and sisters in Christ. When wrestling with God's will, seek input from wise and godly counselors. Christian community is a gift from God and we discern best together. But occasionally, particularly when you're discerning between multiple "goods", you'll want to consider...


Circumstances: It's never wise to begin your discernment by asking God for a "sign" but God can help reveal his will through circumstances. These are hard to discern (i.e. does a closed door mean to move on or to persevere?) but they can be helpful while we've been seeking God through the other means too.

Heart: Although Disney would suggest you begin by following your heart, when it comes to discerning GOD'S will, your heart can be most deceitful. However, there are times (again, often when choosing between "goods") where we can equally honor God and follow God's ways on course A or course B.

This is particularly relevant for our church as our church's Transition Team discerns the best course forward for our church amid our broader denominational turmoil. We covet your continued prayers for wisdom and discernment! By mid-June, the Transition Team intends to present findings and recommendations to our Church Council at which time their discernment process will begin. Thank you for your continued encouragement as we seek God's will!

Next Steps to Connect


