Covid/Mask Update

The Governor recently indicated that the indoor mask mandate will be lifted by the end of February throughout the state of Illinois as long as infections continue in their downward trend. In response, our Church Council has agreed to make masks optional beginning in March. We understand that mask wearing is a contentious topic for many, but out of respect and love for one another, we hope that those attending worship and other events at Troy UMC will be patient and gracious to everyone whether they choose to wear a mask or not. Masks can be a helpful deterrent to ongoing outbreaks and are especially encouraged for those at higher risk of illness. As always, we ask that if you feel sick, or have tested positive for COVID, that you remain at home for the recommended quarantine period. A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Our Transition Team

The broader United Methodist Church has experienced great turmoil since the special session of the General Conference held in St. Louis in 2019 upheld the church's historic stance that God's design for marriage is between one man and one woman for a lifetime and that same sex sexual practice is incompatible with Christian teaching. The great divide in the UMC goes much deeper than human sexuality. The roots of the conflict center around biblical authority, the understanding of sin and the need for God's grace, the nature of salvation, the mission of the church, and even core doctrines such as the Trinity, atonement, and historical resurrection of Jesus. This rift has been growing for decades, and 2019 was a tipping point for many. Hundreds of pastors and churches, along with many bishops, conference boards of ordained ministry, and even entire jurisdictions ignored and defied our shared covenant established by the General Conference (the democratically elected, highest decision-making body in the UMC, and the only group that can officially speak for the UMC). Entire segments of the United Methodist Church in the USA stopped paying general church apportionments directed to support the growing church in Africa and Eastern Europe as retribution for their part in upholding the church's doctrine in 2019. And many groups proposed legislation for separation plans for the 2020 General Conference.


One plan, The Protocol for Reconciliation and Grace through Separation, was mediated by an outside party with representation from all caucus groups as a compromise legislation. It has gained support across the theological spectrum as a way forward by allowing conferences, churches, and pastors to choose between future Methodist expressions without penalty or recourse. But this legislation cannot go into effect until it is adopted by the General Conference. However, as you may know, that 2020 conference has been postponed twice now due to the pandemic preventing international travel. We await a decision to be made before the end of March as to whether that General Conference will indeed be held in August/September of 2022 or will be further delayed. Many churches (of various theological leanings) unwilling to wait any longer, have already gone through the sometimes costly process of disaffiliation from the UMC.

Anticipating these big transitions in the broader church, last August our Church Council commissioned a "Transition Team" to collect information and consider the various options available to us as we envision our preferred future. The objective of our Transition Team has been blessed by our District Superintendent. Members of this team include Andy Adams, Deb Ellis, Sheila Hall, Deb Inman, Mickey Jackson, Mike Loftus, Tim Price, and Jason Wickersham. Our team, who reports to the Church Council and will periodically keep the congregation informed, began meeting monthly in December. As we wait to hear if and when the General Conference will meet, we are collecting information about other Methodist denominations including the Free Methodist Church and the Wesleyan Church. Each of these are being considered by our Transition Team as well as the options of remaining part of the post-separation United Methodist Church, joining the soon-to-becreated Global Methodist Church, becoming an independent church, or affiliating with some other group. Any recommendations the Transition Team makes to the Church Council would ultimately come before our entire church membership for a vote.



GriefShare Offered At Troy UMC

Church and community members who have experienced the death of a family member or friend are invited to register for **GriefShare**.

This nondenominational program features Christ-centered, Biblical teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was seen on the DVD.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or family have returned to their daily life routines. Past participants have related how helpful the information and fol-



low-up discussions were to them. Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and

that you do not need to live in bondage as a slave to certain emotions. You will learn valuable information about facing your new normal in life and renewing your hope for the future. Grief-related books/materials are made available for participants to borrow.

GriefShare will be held Feb. 17 – May 12 from 5-7pm in the Children's area in the Family Life Center of Troy United Methodist Church.
