Greetings,

Over time, I have received an education in how to use and maintain a Facebook account. It has certainly been entertaining in looking up former classmates from high school, college, and seminary. In many ways this has opened doors for communicating the love of Christ, which once again has surfaced as a gentle reminder for the body

of Christ to BE the body of Christ. All too often we neglect a great responsibility in telling others about our living and vital relationship with the creator of the universe. We leave others guessing about the greatest influence in our lives. Rather, we should leave no one guessing by those in our lives about whom our loyalty and devotion belongs.

This serves as a gentle reminder for the theme of Father's Day: responsibility. Is the church acting responsibly? What is the driving force behind the ministries here at FBC? All areas should reflect a heartfelt desire to honor our Savior. All areas are equally important in the life of each individual and thus collectively in the body of Christ. To be responsible as a child of God requires sacrifice in the life of each believer.

That said, no one had to speak about him, he lived his life to the fullest for God and God alone. In other words, he was responsible in faith and lived it out for others to observe. The people of God sing. The role of music in worship is biblical. After escaping from the Egyptians and crossing the Red Sea, the people of Israel sang a song to the Lord (Exodus 15). Singing was part of Israel's formal worship in both tabernacle and temple (1 Chronicles 6:31-32, 16:42). The Psalms bear rich testimony that in joy and sorrow, in praise and lament, the faithful raise their voices in song to God. Hymn singing was practiced by Jesus and his disciples (Matthew 26:30). The Apostle Paul instructed the Colossians, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in

all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:16-17).
