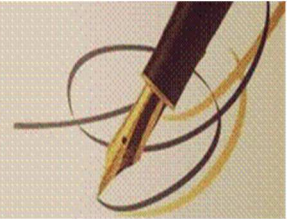

A Little Church History (Pipe Organ)

At the April 9, 1973 Deacon Board meeting, Music Director, Miss Frances Cartner presented a case for a new organ.

The first pipe organ had come in 1911 at a cost of \$2,200. It had served well in the 1909 brick church. It was, in fact, still there when the church was torn down.

The present sanctuary was completed in 1957 and it was time for an adequate pipe organ, Miss Cartner pointed out.

The Board of Deacons agreed and a committee was formed. In fact, an organ fund had been in existence for some time and contained \$11,000. The committee went to various churches, listening to different brands of organs. The recommendation came back to purchase an Austin organ that would cost about \$62,000 plus building modifications. The church gave approval for the expenditure. The contract was signed June 1, 1973.

The Austin organ was first heard by the congregation on February 9, 1975. It remains one of Richmond County's largest and best organs.

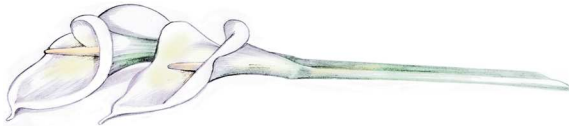
