MISSION MOMENT

Gather for Community

We are steadily progressing toward a sense of at least some normality.

But what's normal?

One of the authors I quote from time to time is Watchman Nee. He was a Chinese pastor, evangelist and writer who died in a Communist prison. Watchman Nee talked about the "normal Christian life" which meant normative, rather than routine or common. Too many Christians, Nee said, aspire only to a normal, comfortable routine life—when God's call for us is anything but. Watchman Nee said we look to Jesus for our 'normative' life. He is the norm toward which we should aspire and there are plenty of others who followed His example toward whom we can look as well:

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross despising the shame and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

- Hebrews 12:1-2

There is no doubt that we endured (and are still enduring) a time of hardship and trial—Covid, the loneliness and isolation of the quarantine, economic hardship, loss of milestone events and longawaited plans, and overwhelming racial tension for all. It has felt a little like a crucifixion. We know that Jesus did not choose crucifixion for Himself. It was His

Father's will and He endured the cross. But from the cross came a resurrection, new life. And in that new life Jesus was glorified. We should look to this pattern of crucifixion, resurrection, and glorification. As Watchman Nee would say, this is normative—although it certainly does not feel normal or routine. There is very little about the last few months that feels normal or routine. And we are anxious to get back to that. However, we need to ask what does Jesus's normal look like? What should be normative for us? If we just seek to return to business as usual, we will cheat ourselves of the new life and the glorification that comes from a crucifixion—like Peter, Andrew, James and John trying to fish again the waters of Galilee.

"What are you doing, Jesus?" has been the foremost question on my mind throughout these difficult months. I have prayed for our Church more and I have prayed for many of you more during these last few months than I have at any time. And God is absolutely faithful. There are amazing signs of new life everywhere we look... although some of it looks far from routine or common.

- We have more children taking part in our 'virtual' VBS held in the homes of families than we have had in several years in our traditional 'on-site' VBS.
- We had an amazing "Serve Day" for City Rescue Mission where we filled a truck with supplies and we gave away one of the greatest single financial gifts in the history of First Pres.

- We continue to see our reach expand and grow through the live-streaming of worship. God was so good to provide this system and help us perfect it before Covid.
- Thanks to your generosity and Jesus' faithfulness, our giving continues to be strong. So far this year our giving is nearly \$200,000 over our spending. Unsolicited, generous gifts continue to come with regularity.
- My conversation with the Pastors talking about George Floyd's murder and racial disparity has been viewed on Facebook alone over 7,000 times and on many other media as well. We are pursuing relationships with African American congregations. Over 30 of you have signed up to be a part of that. Our first conversation is happening the last few days of June. The Holy Spirit is on the move here and it is important for the Church to seize the opportunity to declare the Gospel into our brokenness, rather than allow those consumed with hate and rage to have the final word.
- Our search for a Next Generation Pastor is proceeding on pace and we hope to have news soon.
- · We see new faces in our sanctuary for worship and continue to see many people join us online.
- On July 12, we are planning to open up more with Adult SS, nursery, larger groups, and we'll be serving communion.

Praise God for how He continues to provide for First Pres! There are some challenges as well. Many of you will not be able or won't

feel comfortable returning to the building for some time. We have had to postpone our much anticipated Israel trip. It's easy to feel estranged from folks and get into routines that take us away from our Church family. Communication sometimes has been strained. As a Shepherd, I worry about what sheep have fallen away from the flock. I know Sunday School classes that have met via Zoom have waned. We are desperately missing our Worship Choir and handbells. With the Church being partially open, the staff and leadership is working hard to get reacquainted and rebuild collegiality. I am also aware of being very tired. And I know I am not the only one. I have pastored many other pastors lately and some have pastored me.

I have no doubt that Covid and everything around it will be a winnowing process. Like so many businesses that have been lost, there will be congregations that fade. But I have the strong sense we will be emerging stronger and more focused on our vision of "New Life Through Jesus for Edmond and the World." But

it is important we seek the normal of Jesus, His standard, by looking to Him rather than returning to our historical normal, our routine. Let's make this crucifixion count for something, let's seek the new life and the glory God promises for those who endure and hope.



Beginning with John the Baptist's baptism of Jesus and ending with Jesus Christ's resurrection, Mark covers the basics of the Christian faith and the life of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. My hope is to see the knowledge of scripture impact students' everyday lives and be able to relate student ministry activities



and current events (personal and societal) into our study of scripture.



Jake McKinnon: Serving community is in the DNA of the First Pres Student Ministry. Most recently we had several students ral-

ly behind the Serve Day for the City Rescue Mission, helping with set up, drop-off, and loading up the truck full of donations. Every summer we take students to Generate which is the mission camp we go to. Generate offers us a unique opportunity to have the camp experience, worship, speakers, and community, while allowing us to go off site and do service projects during the day. Christian Worldview - Bill Ball - Fellowship Hall

Americans are divided over many things today: politics, race, economics, ethics; and Christians seem to be divided along the same lines as everyone else. Yet Jesus prayed that we would be one as He and the Father are one. To bring about unity, the issues that divide us need to be frankly discussed among followers of Christ. But before this we need to make sure that we are starting from the same place. This will be our first goal in this class - to attempt to spell out what a Christian worldview is. Our second goal will be to apply this worldview to the various issues of the day. Hopefully there will be lively discussion as well as solid biblical truth. The class will be taught and led by Bill Ball, retired pastor and instructor in New Testament and Theology at the College of Biblical Studies in Houston, TX.

James- the Proverbs of the New Testament - Lee Schmidt - Room 2115

An intensely practical book, filled with exhortations about how we, as Christians, should live our lives now that we have been given new life in Jesus. Filled with allusions to His teachings, and quotations of Jesus, it is packed with 'imperatives,' vitally important points, with which many of us are familiar: Every good and perfect gift is from above..., do not merely listen to the Word...do what it says...,faith without deeds is dead..., and much more. The objective of James is not a theological presentation of the Bible, but is written to Believers with the goal of helping them lead faithful lives as followers of Jesus. This class practices community, fellowship and discussion (koinonia) and all are welcome as we break open this challenging Book as a guide to a life worthy of our calling.

Continuing the study of Job from spring semester, come and experience the dramatic reading of scripture in a new series on Job. A class for young adults in their 20s/30s seeking discussion-based Bible study and a place to meet new friends. Join us!


