## One Contribution, Many Gifts "For the Long Term"

"I don't want flowers, they just make me sneeze!" was my mother's wish when we had "that" meeting all children of elderly parents know will come one day. My mother's ironic sense of humor notwithstanding, she was realistic about the need to make end of life plans if for no other reason than to make that time easier for her two sons.

Yes, she included the church in her estate, but we were not prepared for the many contributions, "in lieu of flowers", suggested in her obituary. We agreed that they should be used to benefit the church, but how? My brother suggested we let the pastor decide. Good idea I thought, but something nagged at me.

In her family, church and career as a college librarian she believed in investing in people. She did so



with her time and money and believed that "in time, good will beget good". That was it then. We would add the money to the Church endowment. Each year since, the endowment has provided money for the Church. We take comfort in knowing that the contributions are part of it and still at work each year over the many years since her passing.

There are many occasions for celebration. They may be the life of a friend or loved-one, the birth of a child, a special anniversary, or to honor a coworker, volunteer or missionary, just to list a few. When those occasions arise consider to do as my brother and I did and make a contribution, small or large, to the Church endowment. It matters, in the long term.
