

Kitchen Volunteers: Monday – Friday, 8am-11am A meal preparation volunteer helps cook, package the meals in time for delivery, and clean the kitchen. No professional cooking experience is required, and cooking is done each day in groups of 4–5.

Delivery Volunteers: Monday - Friday, 10:30am-12:30pm

On weekdays, meal delivery volunteers use their own cars and gas to bring hot meals to homebound individuals in the community. Volunteers can deliver as often as their schedules allow. Corporate and group routes are also available.

Weekend Meal Preparation Volunteers: Thursday afternoon Volunteers will help prepare & package a weekend meal that is delivered on Friday with our regular meal delivery.

No One Dies Alone

A Ministry to the Dying

MISSION

Through the efforts of volunteers, No One Dies Alone provides a reassuring presence to dying patients who would otherwise be alone. With the support of both the nursing staff and case management, the vigil



keepers offer patients the most valuable of human gifts: a dignified death.

PROGRAM FOCUS

To provide healing and compassionate care to those who find themselves alone in the final hours of their lives.

Principles:

- It's about "being rather than doing... about compassionate presence"
- To be a non-anxious presence and truly compassionate with another.

VOLUNTEER BASED PROGRAM

Participation is open to anyone. All volunteers must undergo a preliminary interview. External volunteers must participate in our normal volunteer orientation requirements.

REFERRALS

No One Dies Alone is for Mercy patients who are expected to die within 48 to 72 hours and have no family or friends locally or have no family involved or present. It is expected that most referrals will originate from the nursing staff, chaplains, case managers and the staff ethicist. This program is not intended to provide respite care for family members.

VOLUNTEER INFO

All volunteers must attend a comprehensive training program prior to participating in the program. Training will focus on patient confidentiality, safety and the role and responsibility of a vigil keeper.


