Overview

How can the church remain faithful while we are scattered? That's the question Peter answers in 1 and 2 Peter. At the time these letters were written, Rome was greatly threatened by the rise of Christianity. As a result, believers were forced to move away from prominent cities and into obscurity. In Peter's first letter, he is hoping to build identity and hope in the life of these suffering believers. Around 3 years later, he wrote his second letter (66 AD) with a challenge to continue to live out who they are in Christ. Peter does not want these believers to hope and become complacent. Therefore, 2 Peter is Peter's last effort to spur the church on to be like Christ in the face of opposition.








Challenges
