Message Bible Text:

Matthew 11:1-19

Discussion Questions:

- 1. John the Baptist was "preparing the way" for Jesus. Have you been in a situation when you did the preliminary work but someone else stepped in and finished?
- Christians and churches should be "Great Commandment" and "Great Commission" focused. How is FRC living up to this? How are you doing?
- 3. What is my "heart condition" (Mark 4-The Good Soil) saying about my commitment to Jesus? Is the "fruit" I am producing evidence of who or what I am serving?

Supplemental Bible Texts:

Matthew 28: 19-20; Matthew 22: 37-39; Micah 6:8

Discussion Questions:

- Has there ever been a time in your life that you have doubted the faithfulness of God?
- 2. What drives or feeds the doubts in your life? What is your initial response?

3. How do you get beyond your doubts?

Take-Home Thoughts:

- Like John the Baptist (v. 3) we all have doubts. Our doubts should draw us closer to Jesus.
- Our doubts can serve as a blessing or a curse. What we do with our doubts demonstrate the "fruit" of who we are serving.
