Icebreaker:

Message Bible Text:

Deuteronomy 9:1-6, Numbers 13, Joshua 24

Discussion Questions:

1. Discuss the improbable events that happened in the Bible.
2. Do you recognize God in the improbable moments in your life? How those improbable moments made a huge impact on your life?
3. Do things go well because we are good? Bad because we are bad?

Supplemental Bible Texts:

Titus 3: 4-7, Isaiah 53, Mathew 28, Mathew 16

Discussion Questions:

1. What giants are you facing today?
2. What promise(s) do you remember from scripture? What scriptural promises are you trusting when facing your personal giants?
3. Has anyone taken blame for something you did? Do you recognize that's what Christ did for you?

Take-Home Thoughts:

- God is greater than life's giants! He will take care of them.
- When God delivers, he delivers through improbable ways. The battle belongs to him.
- We only have salvation because the punishment fell on Jesus Christ.
