Being Missional Where You Are

As we journey back to Malawi, we wanted to take a minute to both thank and challenge you as our church family.

We have enjoyed being able to worship and serve alongside you these last 9 months. We have felt love from you as you have prayed for us, given financially to support us, and of course fed us (and that's no small task!). We are eternally grateful for the ways each of you have loved on us: for stocking our house, for friendships, for invites to birthday parties, for meals at your house, for Sunday School teachers and Team Kid workers who love on our kids each week, and on and on. Thank you for your generosity and passion for missions, which is evident by your incredible contributions made to Lottie Moon this year! We are so humbled to be sent out and supported by you! Please know we don't take that lightly! Thank you, Grove's First Baptist!

As we go, we want to also leave you with a challenge. We go on your behalf to the mission field in Malawi, Africa. A couple of thousand other missionaries with the International Mission Board (IMB) go out on your behalf to mission fields all over the world and are recipients of your financial support. And we are all grateful! But supporting missions is not just about giving money so that others may go. It's also about living on mission where you are. While not everyone is called to be a cross-cultural missionary, everyone is called to act like a missionary in their home culture. We can call this attitude living missionally. How can you live missionally in Grove, Oklahoma? We, as Christ-followers, have all been given the Great Commission. As you go in and around Grove (or wherever the Lord takes you), how can you be making disciples among the lost around you?

Here are a few ways we encourage each member of Grove's First Baptist to be on mission where you are.

Pray: Ask God to give you a heart like His toward the lost around you; that you would be slow to anger and show mercy and steadfast love, when you see lost people acting like lost people. Ask God to make you a bold and persistent witness for Him. Ask God to draw the lost around you to salvation and open their eyes to the Good News you are sharing. Pray for other believers living on mission where you are. Continue to pray for and support missionaries all over the world. One resource we use is www.operationworld.org, where you can learn about different countries and the needs there. You can also visit www.imb.org/pray to sign up to receive prayer request calendars, emails, and/or newsletters so that you may pray for IMB missionaries all over the world. You will be surprised how God can use your prayers for others to shape your heart to live on mission for Him.

Share: Be obedient to share the whole gospel with the lost around you. You don't have to have a slick presentation, use "magic words," or even use the same words every time. If you know Christ, then you can talk about your relationship with Christ! We are confident that if you want or need help in learning how to share the Gospel better, any of our pastors or deacons would love to help you!

Be in the Word: The more you read of the Good News in the Bible each day, the more you will be reminded of your own sinful condition and God's call to your heart to repent. The more you daily take up your cross and follow Jesus, the more His Spirit will guide you as you share.

Follow-up: This is where persistence comes in. Don't give up on the lost around you and don't give up on God. Let's be found faithfully doing the work of our Master when He returns for His bride.

Depend on Other Believers: Ask others in your home, small groups, Sunday school classes, etc. to pray for the specific lost people with whom you're sharing. Ask for their help in loving and sharing with that lost person too.

Once again, church family, we are so grateful for you, your love, and your support for our family. We also praise the Lord for how He will use each of you to be on mission where you are too!

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." (Phil 1:3–6, ESV)
